15	MAINTENANCE
16	(a) On or before January 15, 2011, the secretary of agriculture, food and
17	markets shall adopt by rule standards for the design, installation, and

- 18 <u>maintenance of electrically charged wire fences used for the inclusion or</u>
- 19 exclusion of domestic animals, as that term is defined in section 1151 of this
- 20 <u>title. Rules adopted under this section shall:</u>

1	(1) Specify a standard for fencing wire gauge or its equivalent.
2	(2) Specify the maximum height of an electrically charged wire fence.
3	Maximum height may vary for the type of domestic animal subject to inclusion
4	or exclusion by the electrically charged wire fence.
5	(3) Prohibit an electrically charged wire fence from being erected or
6	maintained in contact with a public utility pole, transmission line, or other
7	transmission infrastructure.
8	(4) Specify minimum maintenance requirements for the safe operation
9	of the electrically charged wire fence.
10	(b) In developing the rule required under subsection (a) of this section, the
11	secretary of agriculture, food and markets shall consult with the Vermont farm
12	bureau, electric transmission utilities, animal humane associations, and other
13	interested parties.
14	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE
15	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
