13	(2) Impose an ongoing increase in the inspection sticker fee with the
14	proceeds of the increase reserved for the Department to purchase up to one

Sec. 2. REIMBURSEMENT FOR EQUIPMENT COSTS REQUIRED
UNDER THE AUTOMATED VEHICLE INSPECTION PROGRAM
On or before January 1, 2019, the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall
use amounts of the inspection sticker charge reserved pursuant to 23 V.S.A.
§ 1230(b)(3) to reimburse designated inspection stations that purchased the
equipment package the Department required the stations to obtain in order to
collect and manage inspection data electronically under the Automated Vehicle
<u>Inspection Program</u> . In the case of purchases of equipment under the vendor's
monthly payment plan, the Department shall reimburse the station for the
monthly payments it has made and shall pay the vendor the balance owed. The
Commissioner may anticipate receipts of amounts reserved pursuant to
23 V.S.A. § 1230(b)(3), and shall use other amounts appropriated to the
Department, as may be necessary to make full and timely reimbursements as
required under this section. Each station shall be eligible for reimbursement
for one equipment package only.
