II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Section 2: Amends RCW 18.360.050 (Authorized duties.) to remove the phrase "direct visual" from the supervision requirements of a medical assistant-certified to administer intravenous injections for diagnostic or therapeutic agents.

Current law RCW 43.70.250 (License fees for professions, occupations, and businesses) requires the department to charge a fee to generate sufficient revenue to fully support the costs of administering its medical assistant licensing activities. The department does not anticipate the need to increase licensing fees to support the changes proposed in this bill. The department will monitor all program fund balances and adjust fees over a six (6) year period to ensure that fees are sufficient to cover all program expenditures.

As of July 1, 2022, the Medical Assistant program has sufficient fund balance to cover the costs to implement this bill.

Section 2: The department will develop and adopt rules to remove "direct visual" from supervision requirement language in WAC 246-827-0240. The department anticipates utilizing a team of subject matter experts to implement this bill. This team will consist of the program manager and a community engagement specialist to identify underreached communities and engage them in the rulemaking process. This process will include two meetings with interested parties as well as one formal rules hearing, all held virtually, and will take approximately 12 months to complete. The department anticipates providing the rules hearing announcement and materials in both English and Spanish and providing ASL and Spanish interpretation services at the rules hearing.

Costs include staff, associated expenses (including goods and services, travel, intra-agency, and indirect charges), and Office of Attorney General support in the amount of \$4,000.

FY 2024 one-time costs will be 0.2 FTE and \$29,000.
