II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Sec. 4 (2) (c) - This new subsection stipulates the agency may provide a resource guide for applicants for federal grants, including links to federal applications and relevant resources, and contact information for department assistance. This is determined to be no fiscal impact as this is supported using existing resources.

Fiscal impact for the following section is deemed partially determinate and partially indeterminate impact:

Sec. 4 (4) (a) (b) - The new subsection 4 directs the department to establish and administer a moving assets towards community health program (Program). The purpose of the Program is to increase opportunities for local communities to compete for federal funding by providing matching funds. The bill does not identify funding source or amounts to establish this program. Therefore, Part II of the fiscal note will illustrate the assumptions made to provide meaningful impact that satisfies the intent of the bill.

Sec. 4 (4) (a)(b) - The establishment and administration of a moving assets towards community health program.

Sec. 4 (4) (a)(b) - Directs the department to establish and administer a moving assets towards community health program with a biennial report due to the Governor and Legislature beginning in fiscal year 2028. To administer this program, the Department will require:

0.3 FTE (FY24) EMS2 to provide policy and program development subject matter expertise. Supports the development and creation of the rules to implement the program for the desired outcomes.

1.0 FTE (FY24-29) Commerce Specialist 3 to design, develop, market and implement the program. Manage the biannual report to the Governor and Legislature.

0.5 FTE (FY24-29) Commerce Specialist 3 to negotiate, execute, monitor and close contracts/grants associated with the moving assets towards community health program.

Grant funding:

The amount of grant funding provided for this program is not specified and is therefore indeterminate. However, for illustrative purposes, a \$400,000 grant award could support the application and administration of federal funding, as well as matching funds. With 20 awards provided, the cost for grants would be approximately \$8 million.

Part IV: Analysis A. SUMMARY OF BILL

Description of the bill with an emphasis on how it impacts local government.

Overview: The legislature's intent is to increase the availability of federal grant dollars in local communities by continuing its efforts to increase the capacity of the Department of Commerce to assist local communities in successfully applying for federal grant dollars. Commerce would help local communities by creating the Moving Assets towards Community Health (MATCH) program. The MATCH program would allow local communities to access matching funds that are needed to secure federal grants from a state funding pool.

Sections that impact local government:

Sec. 2 (Amends RCW 43.330.070):

(2) Adds language which allows Commerce to provide technical assistance or enter into contracts with local communities in order to provide them with technical assistance in the development of competitive applications for federal funding.

Sec. 4 (Amends RCW 43.330.260):

(1) (c) Adds language which requires Commerce to provide a resource guild for applicants for federal grants.

(4) Directs COM to establish a MATCH program with the intent to increase opportunities for local communities to compete for federal grants through the provision of a state pool of matching funds for eligible entities to access during the application process.

B. SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURE IMPACTS

Expenditure impacts of the legislation on local governments with the expenditure provisions identified by section number and when appropriate, the detail of expenditures. Delineated between city, county and special district impacts.

This legislation would have an indeterminate expenditure impact on local governments.

Expenditures by cities and counties under this legislation would be expected to increase if they were to seek the technical assistance provided by Commerce and the matching funds provided by the MATCH program. The funds and technical assistance would be utilized by cities and counties to develop more competitive federal grant applications. There is no available information about what the technical assistance provided by COM will provide. There is also no available information about what will be required to apply for the matching funds or what the total amount of matching funds will be available.

C. SUMMARY OF REVENUE IMPACTS

Revenue impacts of the legislation on local governments, with the revenue provisions identified by section number, and when appropriate, the detail of revenue sources. Delineated between city, county and special district impacts.

The legislation would result in indeterminate revenue for cities and counties. Cities and counties would be eligible to apply for technical assistance or matching funds to develop more competitive federal grant applications. There is no information available that would allow of an estimation of city and county revenue increase due to the support provided by the legislation leading to more successful federal grant applications.
