Part IV: Analysis

A. SUMMARY OF BILL

Description of the bill with an emphasis on how it impacts local government.

- Sec. 2. would add a new section to chapter 74.14B allowing a child welfare worker to request to be accompanied by a second trained individual when the child welfare worker has concerns that violence could occur based on a family member's history of violence.
- (2) When a request is made under subsection (1) of this section, the department would be required to arrange for a second trained individual to accompany the child welfare worker unless it is not possible to fulfill the request under the circumstances.
- (3) The second trained individual from a local government that may accompany a child welfare worker include:
- (a) A law enforcement officer;
- (b) A mental health professional; or
- (c) A first responder, such as a firefighter or emergency medical personnel.

B. SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURE IMPACTS

Expenditure impacts of the legislation on local governments with the expenditure provisions identified by section number and when appropriate, the detail of expenditures. Delineated between city, county and special district impacts.

Local law enforcement agencies and locally employed first responders could experience an indeterminate increase in expenditures if they accompany a welfare worker when the worker requests to be accompanied by a second trained individual because there are concerns that violence could occur based on a family member's history of violence. The frequency with which welfare workers may request to be accompanied cannot be predicted in advance, so the potential expenditure impact is indeterminate.

The Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) notes that officers are occasionally present when a child welfare worker (or someone with a like title) is supervising an "exchange" of a child from one custodial guardian to another. Because the legislation would allow welfare workers to request accompaniment, WASPC anticipates law enforcement would likely experience an uptick in requests as behavioral health needs increase in Washington.
