Part II: Narrative Explanation

II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Significant provisions of the bill and any related workload or policy assumptions that have revenue or expenditure impact on the responding agency by section number.

Section 2 requires every person who is eligible to vote to register to vote using one of the methods prescribed in this bill. Waivers from the obligation to vote are allowed. The Secretary of State shall create a form to allow persons to waive the obligation to register to vote.

Section 3 amends current law and requires that each registered voter return a ballot for each primary and general election.

Sections 4, 5, 6, and 7 provides means by which an eligible voter declines to register to vote.

Section 9 requires the top of each ballot to include the following statement "You may leave any portion or the entirety of this ballot blank. However, you are required by law to submit this ballot to your local county elections office by Election Day."

Section 10 requires the Secretary, before the 2026 primary election, to implement a plan for expanded voter registration in the state, including a statewide education plan on the implementation of universal civic duty voting. The Secretary shall report to the legislature the details of the plan and any funding required for implementation by January 1, 2025.

Section 11 requires county election officials, in coordination with the Secretary, to mail to each household and provide to each agency that provides voter registration a notice regarding the changes to the registration and voting requirements. These notifications must be provided by February 1, 2026.

Section 2 of the bill creates a new form that needs to be created, translated, printed, and distributed. Based on recent printing costs, we anticipate that it will cost \$50,000 to print 500,000 forms annually. We believe we have enough staff to create the form. We'd use existing vendors to perform translation and community review. Storage and fulfillment would be coordinated with Department of Enterprise Services and those costs vary monthly with an estimated monthly cost of \$300 (\$3,600 per year).

Currently we are required under section 203 of the voting rights act (52 U.S.C. Sec. 10503) to provide voter registration materials in Spanish, Chinese, and Vietnamese in addition to English. We also publish the state voter registration form in 24 languages to match languages offered by any state agency that is designed as a voter registration assistance agency. This is so that a voter registration form can be included with that agencies materials in the language preferred by the individual. We assume this form would be also translated into the same languages. Translation estimates are \$300 per language.

Translation costs of \$7,200 (\$300 x 24) would be incurred in SFY26 only. Storage and fulfillment costs of \$7,200, and printing costs of \$50,000 would be annual and ongoing.

Section 10 requires the Secretary to work with community partners to ensure the widest possible dissemination of information on the implementation of universal civic duty voting, and report to the legislature the details of this plan and any

funding required to implement it. OSOS assumes working with community partners on development of the plan would be consistent with, and part of, existing ongoing efforts to encourage voting, therefore no cost to develop a plan. However, any additional costs for implementing the plan are indeterminate because the plan is yet to be developed.
