- 1 AN ACT Relating to creating a silver alert system; and adding a 2 new chapter to Title 70 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- Sec. 1. The legislature finds that Washington 4 NEW SECTION. state's elderly population is growing and the number of individuals 5 6 with dementia is increasing. The legislature further finds that 7 approximately sixty percent of individuals with dementia will wander at least once and that if not found within twenty-four hours, up to 8 half of wandering seniors with dementia will suffer serious injury or 9 10 death. The legislature further finds that the state of Washington has 11 a compelling interest in protecting the safety of vulnerable citizens 12 The legislature further finds with cognitive impairments. creating a public notification system to broadcast information about 13 14 missing persons with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or other mental 15 disabilities to aid in their safe return, will help prevent 16 unnecessary suffering and death.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

- 1 (1) "Law enforcement agency" means the law enforcement agency 2 that has primary jurisdiction for locating the missing senior 3 citizen.
- 4 (2) "Silver alert" means a quick response system designed to 5 issue and coordinate alerts following the disappearance of a senior 6 citizen aged sixty-five or older, with a diagnosis of Alzheimer's 7 disease, dementia, or other mental disability.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A law enforcement agency may request a silver alert for a senior citizen over the age of sixty-five when the following conditions apply:
- 11 (1) The person suffers from a mental impairment verified by 12 written documentation;
- 13 (2) The request is made within seventy-two hours of the person's disappearance;
- 15 (3) The disappearance poses a credible threat to the person's 16 health and safety;
- 17 (4) There is sufficient information to provide the public to 18 assist in locating the person; and
- 19 (5) A law enforcement investigation has ruled out alternative 20 explanations for the disappearance.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Within existing resources, the Washington state patrol shall develop and implement a plan, commonly known as a 22 23 "silver alert plan" for voluntary cooperation between local, state, 24 tribal, and other law enforcement agencies, state government agencies, radio and television stations, and cable and satellite 25 systems to enhance the public's ability to assist in recovering 26 senior citizens aged sixty-five or older, with a diagnosis of 27 Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or other mental disability. 28
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. Sections 1 through 4 of this act constitute a new chapter in Title 70 RCW.
