AN ACT Relating to creating a more equitable penalty for failure 1 2 to comply with discover pass requirements by setting the penalty at a level equal to the sales price for a discover pass; and amending RCW 3 4 79A.80.080.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: 5

6 Sec. 1. RCW 79A.80.080 and 2013 2nd sp.s. c 15 s 3 are each amended to read as follows: 7

(1) A discover pass, vehicle access pass, or day-use permit must 8 9 be visibly displayed in the front windshield, or otherwise in a prominent location for motor vehicles without a windshield, of any 10 11 motor vehicle:

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(a) Operating on any recreation site or lands; or

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(b) Parking at any recreation site or lands.

14 (2) The discover pass, the vehicle access pass, or the day-use 15 permit is not required:

16 (a) On private lands, state-owned aquatic lands other than water 17 access areas, or at agency offices, hatcheries, or other facilities where public business is conducted; 18

19 (b) For persons who use, possess, or enter lands owned or managed the agencies for nonrecreational purposes consistent with a 20 by

written authorization from the agency, including but not limited to
 leases, contracts, and easements;

3 (c) On department of fish and wildlife lands only, for persons
4 possessing a current vehicle access pass pursuant to RCW 79A.80.040;
5 or

6 (d) When operating on a road managed by the department of natural 7 resources or the department of fish and wildlife, including a forest 8 or land management road, that is not blocked by a gate.

9 (3)(a) An agency may waive the requirements of this section for 10 any person who has secured the ability to access specific 11 recreational land through the provision of monetary consideration to 12 the agency or for any person attending an event or function that 13 required the provision of monetary compensation to the agency.

14 (b) Special events and group activities are core recreational activities and major public service opportunities within state parks. 15 16 When waiving the requirements of this section for special events, the 17 state parks and recreation commission must consider the direct and indirect costs and benefits to the state, local market rental rates, 18 the public service functions of the event sponsor, and other public 19 interest factors when setting appropriate fees for each event or 20 21 activity.

(4) Failure to comply with subsection (1) of this section is a natural resource infraction under chapter 7.84 RCW. An agency is authorized to issue a notice of infraction to any person who fails to comply with subsection (1)(a) of this section or to any motor vehicle that fails to comply with subsection (1)(b) of this section.

(5) The penalty for failure to comply with the requirements of this section is ((ninety-nine dollars)) equal to the sales price for a discover pass as established under RCW 79A.80.020. This penalty must be ((reduced to fifty-nine dollars)) waived if ((an)) the cited individual provides proof of purchase of a discover pass to the court within fifteen days after the issuance of the notice of violation.

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
