## HOUSE BILL 1356

State of Washington 65th Legislature 2017 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to physician limited licenses; and amending RCW 2 18.71.095.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 18.71.095 and 2001 c 114 s 1 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 The commission may, without examination, issue a limited license 7 to persons who possess the qualifications set forth herein:

8 (1) The commission may, upon the written request of the secretary of the department of social and health services or the secretary of 9 10 corrections, issue a limited license to practice medicine in this 11 state to persons who have been accepted for employment by the 12 department of social and health services or the department of corrections as physicians; who are licensed to practice medicine in 13 14 another state of the United States or in the country of Canada or any province or territory thereof; and who meet all of the qualifications 15 16 for licensure set forth in RCW 18.71.050.

17 Such license shall permit the holder thereof to practice medicine 18 only in connection with patients, residents, or inmates of the state 19 institutions under the control and supervision of the secretary of 20 the department of social and health services or the department of 21 corrections. 1 (2) The commission may issue a limited license to practice 2 medicine in this state to persons who have been accepted for 3 employment by a county or city health department as physicians; who 4 are licensed to practice medicine in another state of the United 5 States or in the country of Canada or any province or territory 6 thereof; and who meet all of the qualifications for licensure set 7 forth in RCW 18.71.050.

8 Such license shall permit the holder thereof to practice medicine 9 only in connection with his or her duties in employment with the city 10 or county health department.

(3) Upon receipt of a completed application showing that the 11 applicant meets all of the requirements for licensure set forth in 12 RCW 18.71.050 except for completion of two years of postgraduate 13 medical training, and that the applicant has been appointed as a 14 resident physician in a program of postgraduate clinical training in 15 16 this state approved by the commission, the commission may issue a 17 limited license to a resident physician. Such license shall permit the resident physician to practice medicine only in connection with 18 19 his or her duties as a resident physician and shall not authorize the physician to engage in any other form of practice. Each resident 20 physician shall practice medicine only under the supervision and 21 control of a physician licensed in this state, but such supervision 22 and control shall not be construed to necessarily require the 23 personal presence of the supervising physician at the place where 24 25 services are rendered.

26 (4)(a) Upon nomination by the dean of ((the)) an accredited school of medicine ((at the University)) in the state of Washington 27 28 or the chief executive officer of a hospital or other appropriate health care facility licensed in the state of Washington, the 29 commission may issue a limited license to a physician applicant 30 31 invited to serve as a teaching-research member of the institution's 32 instructional staff if the sponsoring institution and the applicant give evidence that he or she has graduated from a recognized medical 33 school and has been licensed or otherwise privileged to practice 34 medicine at his or her location of origin. Such license shall permit 35 the recipient to practice medicine only within the confines of the 36 instructional program specified in the application and 37 shall terminate whenever the holder ceases to be involved in that program, 38 39 or at the end of one year, whichever is earlier. Upon request of the 40 applicant and the institutional authority, the license may be

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1 renewed. The holder of a teaching research license under this
2 subsection (4)(a) is eligible for full licensure if the following
3 conditions are met:

(i) If the applicant has not graduated from a school of medicine
located in any state, territory, or possession of the United States,
the District of Columbia, or the Dominion of Canada, the applicant
must satisfactorily pass the certification process by the educational
commission for foreign medical graduates;

9 <u>(ii) The applicant has successfully completed the exam</u> 10 <u>requirements set forth by the commission by rule;</u>

11 (iii) The applicant has the ability to read, write, speak, 12 understand, and be understood in the English language at a level 13 acceptable for performing competent medical care in all practice 14 settings;

15 (iv) The applicant has continuously held a position of associate 16 professor or higher at an accredited Washington state medical school 17 for no less than three years; and

18 (v) The applicant has had no disciplinary action taken in the 19 previous five years.

(b) Upon nomination by the dean of ((the)) an accredited school 20 21 of medicine ((of the University)) in the state of Washington or the 22 chief executive officer of any hospital or appropriate health care facility licensed in the state of Washington, the commission may 23 issue a limited license to an applicant selected by the sponsoring 24 25 institution to be enrolled in one of its designated departmental or 26 divisional fellowship programs provided that the applicant shall have graduated from a recognized medical school and has been granted a 27 license or other appropriate certificate to practice medicine in the 28 29 location of the applicant's origin. Such license shall permit the holder only to practice medicine within the confines of the 30 31 fellowship program to which he or she has been appointed and, upon 32 the request of the applicant and the sponsoring institution, the 33 license may be renewed by the commission ((for no more than a total of two years)). 34

All persons licensed under this section shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the commission to the same extent as other members of the medical profession, in accordance with this chapter and chapter 18.130 RCW.

39 Persons applying for licensure and renewing licenses pursuant to 40 this section shall comply with administrative procedures,

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administrative requirements, and fees determined as provided in RCW 43.70.250 and 43.70.280. Any person who obtains a limited license pursuant to this section may apply for licensure under this chapter, but shall submit a new application form and comply with all other licensing requirements of this chapter.

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
