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## SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1408

State of Washington 64th Legislature 2015 Regular Session

By House Education (originally sponsored by Representatives Ortiz-Self, Magendanz, Sawyer, Santos, Senn, Robinson, Orwall, Tarleton, Bergquist, and Gregerson)

- AN ACT Relating to developing a definition and model for "family engagement coordinator" and other terms used interchangeably with it; creating a new section; and providing an expiration date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that the terms 6 engagement coordinator," "parent and family engagement 7 coordinator," involvement coordinator" and "parent are used interchangeably in various statutes in Title 28A RCW, as well as in 8 the omnibus appropriations act. The legislature further finds that 9 10 this staff position is included in the prototypical school model and 11 received funding in the 2013-2015 omnibus appropriations act. Despite this appropriate recognition of the critical importance of family 12 engagement and the need for such a designated school staff position, 13 there is no single definition of the term, nor is there a model or 14 framework for the staff position. The legislature intends to task the 15 16 office of the education ombuds and the educational opportunity gap 17 oversight and accountability committee with developing a definition term and a model or framework for 18 the position recommending these to the legislature. 19
  - (2) By December 1, 2015, the office of the education ombuds, together with the educational opportunity gap oversight and

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1 accountability committee, shall develop and recommend to the education committees of the legislature a definition for the term 2 that is variously referred to as "family engagement coordinator," 3 "parent and family engagement coordinator," and "parent involvement 4 coordinator" and a model or framework for such a staff position. In 5 6 developing the model or framework for the staff position, the office and the committee shall collaborate with the office of the 7 superintendent of public instruction, the Washington education 8 association, the public school employees of Washington, the 9 Washington school counselors' association, the association of 10 Washington school principals, and the Washington state school 11 directors' association. 12

(3) This section expires July 1, 2016.

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
