## HOUSE BILL 1517

State of Washington 67th Legislature 2021 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to expanding Washington college grant awards; 2 amending RCW 28B.92.205; and repealing RCW 28B.92.060.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.92.205 and 2019 c 406 s 20 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

In addition to other eligibility requirements outlined in this chapter, students who demonstrate financial need are eligible to receive the Washington college grant. Financial need is as follows:

(((1) Until academic year 2020-21, students with family incomes 9 10 between zero and fifty percent of the state median family income, adjusted for family size, shall receive the maximum Washington 11 college grant as defined in RCW 28B.92.030. Grants for students with 12 13 incomes between fifty-one and seventy percent of the state median family income, adjusted for family size, shall be prorated at the 14 15 following percentages of the maximum Washington college grant amount: 16 (a) Seventy percent for students with family incomes between

17 fifty-one and fifty-five percent of the state median family income;

18 (b) Sixty-five percent for students with family incomes between 19 fifty-six and sixty percent of the state median family income;

20 (c) Sixty percent for students with family incomes between sixty21 one and sixty-five percent of the state median family income; and

(d) Fifty percent for students with family incomes between sixtysix and seventy percent of the state median family income.

(2) Beginning with academic year 2020-21, students)) Students 3 with family incomes between zero and ((fifty-five)) 70 percent of the 4 state median family income, adjusted for family size, shall receive 5 6 the maximum Washington college grant as defined in RCW 28B.92.030. Grants for students with incomes between ((fifty-six)) 71 and ((one 7 hundred)) 100 percent of the state median family income, adjusted for 8 family size, shall be prorated at the following percentages of the 9 maximum Washington college grant amount: 10

11 (((a) Seventy)) (1) Fifty percent for students with family 12 incomes between ((fifty-six and sixty)) 71 and 80 percent of the 13 state median family income;

14 ((<del>(b) Sixty</del>)) <u>(2) Twenty-five</u> percent for students with family 15 incomes between ((<del>sixty-one and sixty-five</del>)) <u>81 and 90</u> percent of the 16 state median family income; <u>and</u>

17 ((<del>(c) Fifty</del>)) <u>(3) Ten</u> percent for students with family incomes 18 between ((sixty-six and seventy)) <u>91 and 100</u> percent of the state 19 median family income((;

20 (d) Twenty-four and one-half percent for students with family 21 incomes between seventy-one and seventy-five percent of the state 22 median family income; and

23 (e) Ten percent for students with family incomes between seventy24 six and one hundred percent of the state median family income)).
