## HOUSE BILL 1522

State of Washington 64th Legislature 2015 Regular Session

Read first time 01/22/15. Referred to Committee on Agriculture & Natural Resources.

- AN ACT Relating to establishing a state meat inspection program;
- 2 adding a new chapter to Title 16 RCW; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** It is the intent of the legislature to
- 5 establish an intrastate meat inspection program in order to encourage
- 6 economic investment in the state's livestock industry and promote
- 7 economic development within our communities.
- 8 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The definitions in this section apply
- 9 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires
- 10 otherwise.
- 11 (1) "Custom meat facility" means a facility operated by a person
- 12 under this chapter licensed to prepare meat food animals and meat
- 13 food birds for intrastate consumption in Washington.
- 14 (2) "Department" means the Washington state department of
- 15 agriculture.
- 16 (3) "License" means an annual authorization from the department
- 17 issued under this chapter that allows the holder to operate a custom
- 18 meat facility.
- 19 (4) "Meat food animal" includes the following animal
- 20 classifications: Bovine, porcine, ovine, equine, or hircine.

- 1 (5) "Meat food bird" includes chickens, ducks, geese, ratites 2 such as ostriches, emus, and rheas, and similar birds.
- 3 (6) "Official establishment" means an establishment operated for 4 the purpose of preparing meat for human consumption in compliance 5 with chapter 16.49 RCW.
- 6 (7) "Prepared" means smoked, salted, rendered, boned, cut, or otherwise processed.
- 8 (8) "Uninspected meat" means the carcasses or carcass parts of 9 meat food animals or meat food birds that have been slaughtered by 10 the owner of the animals or birds.
- 11 (9) "Washington inspected meat" means the carcasses or carcass
  12 parts of meat food animals or meat food birds that have been
  13 inspected at establishments subject to inspection under chapter 16.49
  14 RCW.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) The department shall make available an annual custom meat license that allows the holder to operate a custom meat facility. Custom farm slaughterers must obtain a separate license for each mobile unit.
- 19 (2) Application for a license or a license renewal must be made 20 on a form prescribed by the department and accompanied by a twenty-21 five dollar license fee. The application must include:
- 22 (a) The full name and address of the applicant, and if the 23 applicant is a partnership or corporation, the full name and address 24 of each partner or officer;
- 25 (b) The physical location address of each establishment or 26 facility to be licensed;
- 27 (c) The name and address of a resident of this state authorized 28 to accept legal notices for the applicant; and
  - (d) Any other information prescribed by the department.

- 30 (3) Initial issuance of a license requires a prelicense 31 inspection by the department for compliance with this chapter and 32 rules adopted under this chapter. A license may only be issued after 33 an applicant is found to be in substantial compliance with this 34 chapter and rules adopted under this chapter.
- 35 (4) Unless designated otherwise by the department, licenses 36 issued under this chapter expire June 30th of each year.
  - (5) Licenses issued under this chapter are not transferrable.

- 1 (6) All license fees collected under this section must be
- 2 deposited in the meat inspection account created in section 9 of this
- 3 act.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The department shall enforce and carry out
- 5 the provisions of this chapter and may adopt rules necessary to carry
- 6 out its purpose. Rules adopted under this chapter may include, but
- 7 are not limited to:
- 8 (1) Requirements for construction, equipment, cleaning,
- 9 sanitation, and sanitary practices related to a custom meat facility
- 10 to ensure sanitary operations;
- 11 (2) Requirements for identification or tagging of meat food
- 12 animals slaughtered by licensees to maintain identification of the
- 13 animal;
- 14 (3) Requirements for handling and storing meats and meat
- 15 products;
- 16 (4) Requirements for labeling meat and meat products; and
- 17 (5) Requirements for slaughtering and processing meat food birds
- 18 by licensees.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Inspected meat and meat products prepared
- 20 for public sale must be kept separated from meat and meat products
- 21 prepared for private individuals.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** (1) The department may investigate any
- 23 violation or possible violation of this chapter or any rule adopted
- 24 under this chapter. To assist in such an investigation, the
- 25 department may issue subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses
- 26 or to compel production of records or documents anywhere in the
- 27 state.
- 28 (2) The department may also inspect the mobile unit of any custom
- 29 farm slaughterer or custom meat facility at any reasonable time to
- 30 determine compliance with this chapter and the rules adopted under
- 31 this chapter.
- 32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** (1) The department may deny, suspend, or
- 33 revoke any license required under this chapter if the department
- 34 determines that an applicant or licensee has committed any of the
- 35 following acts:

- 1 (a) Refused, neglected, or failed to comply with the provisions 2 of this chapter, the rules adopted under this chapter, or any lawful 3 order of the department;
  - (b) Refused, neglected, or failed to keep and maintain records required under this chapter, or rules adopted under this chapter, or to make the records available to the department on request; or

- (c) Refused the department access to any custom meat facilities or parts of the facilities for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter.
- 10 (2) A person may request a hearing under chapter 34.05 RCW upon 11 receipt of notice by the department to deny, suspend, or revoke a 12 license.

## 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** (1) It is unlawful for any person to:

- 14 (a) Operate a custom meat facility in this state without first
  15 obtaining a license from the department under this chapter; and
- 16 (b) Interfere with the department in the performance of the 17 department's duties under this chapter or the rules adopted under 18 this chapter.
  - (2) Any person who fails to comply with this chapter or the rules adopted under this chapter may be subject to a civil penalty in an amount of not more than one thousand dollars per violation per day. Each violation is a separate and distinct offense.
- 23 (3) All moneys collected for civil penalties under this chapter 24 must be deposited in the meat inspection account, created in section 25 9 of this act, to be used solely for the implementation of this 26 chapter.
- 27 NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. The meat inspection account is created in the custody of the state treasurer. All receipts from sections 3 and 28 29 8 of this act must be deposited into the account. Expenditures from the account may be used only for the purposes of implementing this 30 chapter. Only the director of the department or the director's 31 designee may authorize expenditures from the account. The account is 32 subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an 33 34 appropriation is not required for expenditures.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. (1) This chapter applies only to livestock produced in Washington and the meat food animal products

- and meat food bird products produced and consumed from Washingtonproduced livestock.
- 3 (2) Nothing in this chapter prohibits the operator of a custom 4 meat facility from also being licensed to prepare and sell inspected 5 meat out-of-state.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 11. Chapter 34.05 RCW governs the rights, remedies, and procedures respecting the administration of this chapter, including rule making, assessment of civil penalties, emergency actions, and license suspension, revocation, or denial.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 12. Any federal law, rule, order, or other act by the federal government violating the provisions of this chapter is hereby declared to be invalid in this state, is not recognized by and is specifically rejected by this state, and is considered as null and void and of no effect in this state.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 13. The provisions of this chapter relating to the sale of inspected meat in custom meat facilities do not supersede or restrict the authority of any county or any city to adopt ordinances that are more restrictive for the handling and sale of inspected meat than those provided in this chapter.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 14. Sections 1 through 13 of this act constitute a new chapter in Title 16 RCW.
