AN ACT Relating to enacting the good faith pain act; adding a new section to chapter 18.22 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 18.32 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 18.57 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 18.64 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 18.71 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 18.71A RCW; adding a new section to chapter 18.79 RCW; creating a new section; and declaring an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 18.22 10 RCW to read as follows:

11 No podiatric physician and surgeon licensed under this chapter acting in good faith may be subject to criminal or civil liability, 12 or disciplinary action by the board or department for prescribing 13 14 opioid drugs for legitimate medical purposes in the course of 15 professional practice to a patient with chronic pain in who 16 consultation with their practitioner has deemed an opioid 17 prescription medically appropriate and has signed a written informed 18 consent that is documented in the patient's medical records.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 18.32 20 RCW to read as follows:

1 No dentist licensed under this chapter acting in good faith may be subject to criminal or civil liability, or disciplinary action by 2 the commission or department of health for prescribing opioid drugs 3 for legitimate medical purposes in the course of professional 4 practice to a patient with chronic pain who in consultation with 5 their practitioner has deemed an opioid prescription medically 6 7 appropriate and has signed a written informed consent that is documented in the patient's medical records. 8

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 18.57 10 RCW to read as follows:

No osteopathic physician and surgeon licensed under this chapter 11 acting in good faith may be subject to criminal or civil liability, 12 or disciplinary action by the board or department for prescribing 13 opioid drugs for legitimate medical purposes in the course 14 of 15 professional practice to a patient with chronic pain who in consultation with their practitioner 16 has deemed an opioid 17 prescription medically appropriate and has signed a written informed consent that is documented in the patient's medical records. 18

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 18.64 20 RCW to read as follows:

No pharmacist licensed under this chapter acting in good faith 21 may be subject to criminal or civil liability, or disciplinary action 22 23 by the commission or department for dispensing prescription opioid 24 drugs, after confirming that a prescription is valid, if the 25 prescription opioid drugs were prescribed for legitimate medical purposes in the course of professional practice to a patient with 26 27 chronic pain who has presented such a prescription and has been provided with consultation. 28

29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 18.71
30 RCW to read as follows:

No physician licensed under this chapter acting in good faith may be subject to criminal or civil liability, or disciplinary action by the commission or department of health for prescribing opioid drugs for legitimate medical purposes in the course of professional practice to a patient with chronic pain who in consultation with their practitioner has deemed an opioid prescription medically

1 appropriate and has signed a written informed consent that is 2 documented in the patient's medical records.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 18.71A 4 RCW to read as follows:

No physician assistant licensed under this chapter acting in good 5 faith may be subject to criminal or civil liability, or disciplinary 6 action by the commission or department for prescribing opioid drugs 7 for legitimate medical purposes in the course of professional 8 practice to a patient with chronic pain who in consultation with 9 10 their practitioner has deemed an opioid prescription medically appropriate and has signed a written informed consent that is 11 12 documented in the patient's medical records.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. A new section is added to chapter 18.79
14 RCW to read as follows:

15 No advanced registered nurse practitioner licensed under this chapter may be subject to criminal or civil liability, 16 or disciplinary action by the commission or department for prescribing 17 18 opioid drugs for legitimate medical purposes in the course of 19 professional practice to a patient with chronic pain who in consultation with their practitioner has deemed an 20 opioid prescription medically appropriate and has signed a written informed 21 consent that is documented in the patient's medical records. 22

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. This act may be known and cited as the 24 good faith pain act.

25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. This act is necessary for the immediate 26 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 27 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 28 effect immediately.

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
