## HOUSE BILL 1736

State of Washington 68th Legislature 2023 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to requiring the department of licensing to collect vehicle odometer readings at the time of original vehicle registration and registration renewal; amending RCW 46.16A.040 and 46.16A.110; creating a new section; and providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. For the purpose of gaining more accurate 7 information on vehicle miles traveled in the state, including by geographical region, to further state transportation planning efforts 8 and the transportation system policy goals of preservation, safety, 9 10 stewardship, mobility, economic vitality, and protection of the 11 environment established in RCW 47.04.280, as well as to facilitate 12 development of alternative transportation funding mechanisms, the legislature finds it necessary to collect motor vehicle mileage 13 14 information through the reporting of annual odometer readings. 15 Therefore, the legislature intends to require the department of 16 licensing to begin collecting motor vehicle odometer mileage upon 17 vehicle registration beginning March 1, 2024.

18 Sec. 2. RCW 46.16A.040 and 2017 c 147 s 4 are each amended to 19 read as follows: 1 (1) An owner or the owner's authorized representative must apply 2 for an original vehicle registration to the department, county 3 auditor or other agent, or subagent appointed by the director on a 4 form furnished by the department. The application must contain:

5 (a) A description of the vehicle, including its make, model, 6 vehicle identification number, type of body, and power to be used;

7 (b) The name and address of the person who is the registered 8 owner of the vehicle and, if the vehicle is subject to a security 9 interest, the name and address of the secured party;

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(c) The purpose for which the vehicle is to be used;

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(d) The licensed gross weight for the vehicle, which is:

(i) The adult seating capacity, including the operator, as provided for in RCW 46.16A.455(1) if the vehicle will be operated as a for hire vehicle or auto stage and has a seating capacity of more than six; or

16 (ii) The gross weight declared by the applicant as required in 17 RCW 46.16A.455(2) if the vehicle will be operated as a motor truck, 18 tractor, or truck tractor;

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(e) The empty scale weight of the vehicle; ((and))

20 (f) <u>If being registered for on-road use</u>, the mileage shown on the 21 <u>odometer of the motor vehicle at the time of application; and</u>

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(g) Other information that the department may require.

(2) The registered owner or the registered owner's authorized representative shall sign the application for an original vehicle registration and certify that the statements on the application are true to the best of the applicant's knowledge.

(3) The application for an original vehicle registration must be accompanied by a draft, money order, certified bank check, or cash for all fees and taxes due for the application for an original vehicle registration.

(4) Whenever any person, after applying for or receiving a vehicle registration, moves from the address named in the application or in the registration issued to him or her, or changes his or her name of record, the person shall, within ((ten)) <u>10</u> days thereafter, notify the department of the name or address change as provided in RCW 46.08.195.

37 Sec. 3. RCW 46.16A.110 and 2014 c 80 s 3 are each amended to 38 read as follows:

1 (1) A registered owner or the registered owner's authorized representative must apply for a renewal vehicle registration to the 2 3 department, county auditor or other agent, or subagent appointed by the director on a form approved by the director. The application for 4 a renewal vehicle registration must be accompanied by a draft, money 5 6 order, certified bank check, or cash for all fees and taxes required 7 by law for the application for a renewal vehicle registration, and if a motor vehicle is being registered for on-road use, must include the 8 mileage shown on the odometer of the vehicle at the time of 9 application. 10

11 (2) (a) When a vehicle changes ownership, the person taking 12 ownership or his or her authorized representative must apply for a renewal vehicle registration as provided in subsection (1) of this 13 14 section and, except as provided in (b) of this subsection, pay all the taxes and fees that are due at the time of registration renewal. 15 16 For the purposes of this section, when a vehicle is sold to a vehicle 17 dealer for resale, the application for a renewal registration need 18 not be made until the vehicle is sold by the vehicle dealer.

(b) The person taking ownership or his or her authorized representative must be given credit for the portion of a motor vehicle excise tax, including the motor vehicle excise tax collected under RCW 81.104.160, that reflects the remaining period for which the tax was initially paid by the previous owner.

(3) An application and the fees and taxes for a renewal vehicle registration must be handled in the same manner as an original vehicle registration application. The registration does not need to show the name of the lienholder when the application for renewal vehicle registration becomes the renewal registration upon validation.

(4) A person expecting to be out of state during the normal 30 31 renewal period of a vehicle registration may renew a vehicle 32 registration and have license plates or tabs preissued by applying for a renewal as described in subsection (1) of this section. A 33 vehicle registration may be renewed for the subsequent registration 34 year up to ((eighteen)) 18 months before the current expiration date 35 36 and must be displayed from the date of issue or from the day of the expiration of the current registration year, whichever date is later. 37

38 (5) An application for a renewal vehicle registration is not 39 required for those vehicles owned, rented, or leased by:

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(a) The state of Washington, or by any county, city, town, school
district, or other political subdivision of the state of Washington;
or

4 (b) A governing body of an Indian tribe located within this state 5 and recognized as a governmental entity by the United States 6 department of the interior.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. This act takes effect March 1, 2024.

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
