## HOUSE BILL 1781

State of Washington 68th Legislature 2023 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to modifying boater safety and education 2 requirements; amending RCW 79A.60.010, 79A.60.630, and 79A.60.640; 3 adding a new section to chapter 79A.60 RCW; and creating a new 4 section.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the Washington 7 state parks and recreation commission oversees a robust boating safety education program that has been successful in educating the 8 motor boating public to increase safety on the water. The legislature 9 10 further finds that recent data on Washington boating fatalities show 11 that there are more reportable fatalities on human-powered watercraft than on other types of vessels. Therefore, the legislature intends to 12 reduce the risk of accidents and fatalities among recreational 13 operators of human-powered watercraft by establishing a new safety 14 15 education program for human-powered watercraft.

16 Sec. 2. RCW 79A.60.010 and 2005 c 392 s 2 are each amended to 17 read as follows:

18 ((Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the)) The 19 definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter <u>unless the</u> 20 <u>context clearly requires otherwise</u>. 1 (1) "Accredited course" means a mandatory course of instruction 2 on boating safety education that has been approved by the commission.

3 (2) "Boat wastes" includes, but is not limited to, sewage, 4 garbage, marine debris, plastics, contaminated bilge water, cleaning 5 solvents, paint scrapings, or discarded petroleum products associated 6 with the use of vessels.

7 (3) "Boater" means any person on a vessel on waters of the state8 of Washington.

9 (4) "Boater education card" means a card issued to a person who 10 has successfully completed a boating safety education test and has 11 paid the registration fee for a serial number record to be maintained 12 in the commission's database.

13 (5) "Boating educator" means a person providing an accredited 14 course.

(6) "Carrying passengers for hire" means carrying passengers in a 15 16 vessel on waters of the state for valuable consideration, whether given directly or indirectly or received by the owner, agent, 17 operator, or other person having an interest in the vessel. This 18 shall not include trips where expenses for food, transportation, or 19 incidentals are shared by participants on an even basis. Anyone 20 receiving compensation for skills or money for amortization of 21 22 equipment and carrying passengers shall be considered to be carrying passengers for hire on waters of the state. 23

(7) "Certificate of accomplishment" means a form of certificate
 approved by the commission and issued by a boating educator to a
 person who has successfully completed an accredited course.

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(8) "Commission" means the state parks and recreation commission.

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(9) "Darkness" means that period between sunset and sunrise.

(10) "Environmentally sensitive area" means a restricted body of water where discharge of untreated sewage from boats is especially detrimental because of limited flushing, shallow water, commercial or recreational shellfish, swimming areas, diversity of species, the absence of other pollution sources, or other characteristics.

(11) "Guide" means any individual, including but not limited to subcontractors and independent contractors, engaged for compensation or other consideration by a whitewater river outfitter for the purpose of operating vessels. A person licensed under RCW 77.65.480 or 77.65.440 and acting as a fishing guide is not considered a guide for the purposes of this chapter. 1 (12) "Marina" means a facility providing boat moorage space, 2 fuel, or commercial services. Commercial services include but are not 3 limited to overnight or live-aboard boating accommodations.

4 (13) "Motor-driven boats and vessels" means all boats and vessels 5 which are self-propelled.

6 (14) "Motor vessel safety operating and equipment checklist" 7 means a printed list of the safety requirements for a vessel with a 8 motor installed or attached to the vessel being rented, chartered, or 9 leased and meeting minimum requirements adopted by the commission in 10 accordance with RCW 79A.60.630.

(15) "Muffler" or "muffler system" means a sound suppression device or system, including an underwater exhaust system, designed and installed to abate the sound of exhaust gases emitted from an internal combustion engine and that prevents excessive or unusual noise.

16 (16) "Operate" means to steer, direct, or otherwise have physical 17 control of a vessel that is underway.

18 (17) "Operator" means an individual who steers, directs, or 19 otherwise has physical control of a vessel that is underway or 20 exercises actual authority to control the person at the helm.

(18) "Observer" means the individual riding in a vessel who is responsible for observing a water skier at all times.

(19) "Owner" means a person who has a lawful right to possession of a vessel by purchase, exchange, gift, lease, inheritance, or legal action whether or not the vessel is subject to a security interest.

(20) "Person" means any individual, sole proprietorship,
 partnership, corporation, nonprofit corporation or organization,
 limited liability company, firm, association, or other legal entity
 located within or outside this state.

30 (21) "Personal flotation device" means a buoyancy device, life 31 preserver, buoyant vest, ring buoy, or buoy cushion that is designed 32 to float a person in the water and that is approved by the 33 commission.

34 (22) "Personal watercraft" means a vessel of less than 35 ((sixteen)) <u>16</u> feet that uses a motor powering a water jet pump, as 36 its primary source of motive power and that is designed to be 37 operated by a person sitting, standing, or kneeling on, or being 38 towed behind the vessel, rather than in the conventional manner of 39 sitting or standing inside the vessel.

1 (23) "Polluted area" means a body of water used by boaters that 2 is contaminated by boat wastes at unacceptable levels, based on 3 applicable water quality and shellfish standards.

4 (24) "Public entities" means all elected or appointed bodies,
5 including tribal governments, responsible for collecting and spending
6 public funds.

7 (25) "Reckless" or "recklessly" means acting carelessly and 8 heedlessly in a willful and wanton disregard of the rights, safety, 9 or property of another.

10 (26) "Rental motor vessel" means a motor vessel that is legally 11 owned by a person that is registered as a rental and leasing agency 12 for recreational motor vessels, and for which there is a written and 13 signed rental, charter, or lease agreement between the owner, or 14 owner's agent, of the vessel and the operator of the vessel.

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(27) "Sewage pumpout or dump unit" means:

16 (a) A receiving chamber or tank designed to receive vessel sewage 17 from a "porta-potty" or a portable container; and

(b) A stationary or portable mechanical device on land, a dock,
pier, float, barge, vessel, or other location convenient to boaters,
designed to remove sewage waste from holding tanks on vessels.

21 (28) "Underway" means that a vessel is not at anchor, or made 22 fast to the shore, or aground.

(29) "Vessel" includes every description of watercraft on the water, other than a seaplane, used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on the water. However, it does not include inner tubes, air mattresses, sailboards, and small rafts or flotation devices or toys customarily used by swimmers.

(30) "Water skiing" means the physical act of being towed behind
a vessel on, but not limited to, any skis, aquaplane, kneeboard,
tube, or any other similar device.

31 (31) "Waters of the state" means any waters within the 32 territorial limits of Washington state.

33 (32) "Whitewater river outfitter" means any person who is 34 advertising to carry or carries passengers for hire on any whitewater 35 river of the state, but does not include any person whose only 36 service on a given trip is providing instruction in canoeing or 37 kayaking skills.

38 (33) "Whitewater rivers of the state" means those rivers and 39 streams, or parts thereof, within the boundaries of the state as

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1 listed in RCW 79A.60.470 or as designated by the commission under RCW 2 79A.60.495.

3 (34) (a) "Human-powered vessel" means a vessel powered only by its 4 occupant or occupants including, but not limited to, a vessel powered 5 only by the occupant's hands or feet, oars, or paddles.

6 <u>(b) "Human-powered vessel" includes, but is not limited to,</u> 7 <u>canoes, kayaks, and stand-up paddleboards.</u>

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(c) "Human-powered vessel" does not include surfboards.

9 <u>(35) "Paddle education card" means a card issued to a person who</u> 10 <u>has successfully completed a human-powered vessel boating safety</u> 11 <u>education test and has paid the registration fee for a serial number</u> 12 <u>record to be maintained in the commission's database.</u>

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 79A.60 14 RCW to read as follows:

(1) By January 1, 2024, the commission shall adopt by rule and 15 16 implement a program to provide required boating safety education for a boater operating a human-powered vessel. To obtain a paddle 17 18 education card, a person shall provide a certificate of accomplishment issued by a boating educator for taking and passing a 19 20 human-powered vessel safety education course, pass an equivalency exam, or provide proof of completion of a course that meets the 21 22 standard adopted by the commission.

(2) As part of the human-powered vessel safety education program,the commission shall:

(a) Establish a program for human-powered vessels that also
 includes an abbreviated program or checklist for individuals that are
 renting human-powered vessels for short-term use;

(b) Adopt minimum standards for a human-powered vessel safety
 education course of instruction and examination;

30 (c) Approve and provide accreditation to human-powered vessel 31 safety education courses for human-powered vessels operated by 32 volunteers or commercial or nonprofit organizations;

33 (d) Develop an equivalency examination that may be taken as an 34 alternative to the human-powered vessel safety education course;

35 (e) Establish a fee of \$10 for the paddle education card to fund 36 all commission activities related to the human-powered vessel safety 37 education program. The commission shall develop an electronic option 38 for a paddle education card that can be stored digitally in addition 39 to a physical card. Any surplus funds resulting from the fees

1 received must be distributed by the commission as grants to local 2 marine law enforcement programs approved by the commission as 3 provided in RCW 88.02.650;

4 (f) Establish a fee for the replacement of the paddle education 5 card that covers the cost of replacement;

6 (g) Consider and evaluate public agency and commercial 7 opportunities to assist in program administration with the intent to 8 keep administrative costs to a minimum;

9 (h) Approve and provide accreditation to human-powered vessel 10 safety education courses offered online; and

(i) Coordinate with the department of licensing to offer a voluntary registration program for human-powered vessels.

13 (3) A paddle education card expires and is no longer valid 20 14 years after the date of issuance. A person may renew a paddle 15 education card by:

(a) Providing the commission a certificate of accomplishment
 issued by a human-powered vessel safety educator for taking and
 passing an accredited human-powered vessel safety education course;

19 (b) Passing an equivalency exam developed by the commission; or

20 (c) Providing the commission proof of completion of a course that 21 meets the standard adopted by the commission.

(4) A boater possessing a valid boater education card required under RCW 79A.60.630 is not required to obtain a paddle education card to operate a human-powered vessel.

25 Sec. 4. RCW 79A.60.630 and 2019 c 293 s 1 are each amended to 26 read as follows:

27 (1) The commission shall establish and implement by rule a program to provide required boating safety education. The boating 28 safety education program shall include training on preventing the 29 30 spread of aquatic invasive species. The boating safety education 31 program shall include educational materials regarding whale watching guidelines and other voluntary and regulatory measures related to 32 whale watching. The program ((shall be phased in so that)) must 33 <u>require</u> all boaters not exempted under RCW 79A.60.640((<del>(3)</del> are 34 required)) (2) to obtain a boater education card ((by January 1, 35 2016)). To obtain a boater education card, a boater shall provide a 36 certificate of accomplishment issued by a boating educator for taking 37 38 and passing an accredited boating safety education course, or pass an

1 equivalency exam, or provide proof of completion of a course that meets the standard adopted by the commission. 2

(2) As part of the boating safety education program, the 3 commission shall: 4

(a) ((Establish a program to be phased over eleven years starting 5 6 July 1, 2005, with full implementation by January 1, 2016. The period July 1, 2005, through December 31, 2007, will be program development, 7 boater notification of the new requirements for mandatory education, 8 and processing cards to be issued to individuals having taken an 9 accredited course prior to January 1, 2008. The schedule for phase-in 10 of the mandatory education requirement by age group is as follows: 11 12 January 1, 2008 - All boat operators twenty years old and younger; January 1, 2009 - All boat operators twenty-five years old and 13 <del>younger;</del> 14 January 1, 2010 - All boat operators thirty years old and younger;

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16 January 1, 2011 - All boat operators thirty-five years old and 17 younger;

18 January 1, 2012 - All boat operators forty years old and younger;

19 January 1, 2013 - All boat operators fifty years old and younger;

January 1, 2014 - All boat operators sixty years old and younger; 20

21 January 1, 2015 - All boat operators seventy years old and younger;

January 1, 2016 - All boat operators; 22

23 (b)) Establish a minimum standard of boating safety education accomplishment. The standard must be consistent with the applicable 24 25 standard established by the national association of state boating law 26 administrators;

27 ((<del>(c)</del>)) <u>(b)</u> Adopt minimum standards for boating safety education 28 course of instruction and examination that ensures compliance with the national association of state boating law administrators minimum 29 30 standards;

31 ((<del>(d)</del>)) (c) Approve and provide accreditation to boating safety 32 education courses operated by volunteers, or commercial or nonprofit organizations, including, but not limited to, courses given by the 33 34 United States coast guard auxiliary and the United States power 35 squadrons;

((<del>(e)</del>)) <u>(d)</u> Develop an equivalency examination that may be taken 36 as an alternative to the boating safety education course; 37

((<del>(f)</del>)) <u>(e)</u> Establish a fee of ((ten dollars)) <u>\$10</u> for the boater 38 39 education card to fund all commission activities related to the 40 boating safety education program created by chapter 392, Laws of 1 2005, including the initial costs of developing the program. <u>The</u> 2 commission shall develop an electronic option for a paddle education 3 card that can be stored digitally in addition to a physical card. Any 4 surplus funds resulting from the fees received shall be distributed 5 by the commission as grants to local marine law enforcement programs 6 approved by the commission as provided in RCW 88.02.650;

7 ((<del>(g)</del>)) <u>(f)</u> Establish a fee for the replacement of the boater 8 education card that covers the cost of replacement;

9 ((<del>(h)</del>)) <u>(g)</u> Consider and evaluate public agency and commercial 10 opportunities to assist in program administration with the intent to 11 keep administrative costs to a minimum; <u>and</u>

12 ((((i))) (h) Approve and provide accreditation to boating safety
13 education courses offered online((; and

14 (j) Provide a report to the legislature by January 1, 2008, on 15 its progress of implementation of the mandatory education program)).

16 <u>(3) A boater education card expires and is no longer valid 20</u>
17 years after the date of issuance. A person may renew
18 a boater education card by:

19 <u>(a) Providing the commission a certificate of accomplishment</u> 20 <u>issued by a boating educator for taking and passing an accredited</u> 21 <u>boating safety education course;</u>

22 (b) Passing an equivalency exam developed by the commission; or

23 (c) Providing the commission proof of completion of a course that 24 meets the standard adopted by the commission.

25 Sec. 5. RCW 79A.60.640 and 2005 c 392 s 4 are each amended to 26 read as follows:

(1) No person shall operate or permit the operation of <u>human-</u>
 <u>powered vessels or</u> motor-driven boats and vessels ((<del>with a mechanical</del>
 <del>power of fifteen horsepower or greater</del>)) unless the person:

30 (a) Is at least ((<del>twelve</del>)) <u>12</u> years of age, except that an 31 operator of a personal watercraft shall comply with the age 32 requirements under RCW 79A.60.190; and

(b) (i) Has in his or her possession a boater education card <u>or a</u> <u>paddle education card for human-powered vessels</u>, unless exempted under subsection ((<del>(3)</del>)) <u>(2)</u> of this section; or

36 (ii) Is accompanied by and is under the direct supervision of a 37 person ((sixteen)) <u>16</u> years of age or older who is in possession of a 38 boater education card((r or who is not yet required to possess the 1 card as provided in the program phase in RCW 79A.60.630(2)(a)) or a
2 paddle education card for human-powered vessels.

3 (2) ((Any person who can demonstrate they have successfully completed, prior to July 24, 2005, a boating safety education course 4 substantially equivalent to the standards adopted by the commission 5 6 shall be eligible for a boater education card upon application to the commission and payment of the fee, without having to take a course or 7 equivalency exam as provided in RCW 79A.60.630(1). Successful 8 completion of a boating safety education course could include an 9 original or copy of an original certificate issued by the commission, 10 the United States coast guard auxiliary, or the United States power 11 squadrons, or official certification by these organizations that the 12 individual successfully completed a course substantially equivalent 13 to the standards adopted by the commission. 14

15 (3)) The following persons are not required to carry a boater 16 education card:

(a) The operator of a vessel engaged in a lawful commercial fishery operation as licensed by the department of fish and wildlife under Title 77 RCW. However, the person when operating a vessel for recreational purposes must carry either a valid commercial fishing license issued by the department of fish and wildlife or a boater education card;

(b) Any person who possesses a valid marine operator license issued by the United States coast guard when operating a vessel authorized by such coast guard license. However, the person when operating a vessel for recreational purposes must carry either a valid marine operator license issued by the United States coast guard or a boater education card;

(c) Any person who is legally engaged in the operation of a vessel that is exempt from vessel registration requirements under chapter 88.02 RCW and applicable rules and is used for purposes of law enforcement or official government work. However, the person when operating a vessel for recreational purposes must carry a boater education card;

35 (d) Any person at least ((twelve)) <u>12</u> years old renting, 36 chartering, or leasing a <u>human-powered vessel</u>, motor-driven boat, or 37 vessel ((with an engine power of fifteen horsepower or greater)) who 38 completes a commission-approved motor vessel safety operating and 39 equipment checklist each time before operating the motor-driven boat

or vessel, except that an operator of a personal watercraft shall
 comply with the age requirements under RCW 79A.60.190;

3 (e) Any person who is not a resident of Washington state and who 4 does not operate a motor-driven boat or vessel ((with an engine power 5 of fifteen horsepower or greater)) in waters of the state for more 6 than ((sixty)) 60 consecutive days;

7 (f) Any person who is not a resident of Washington state and who 8 holds a current out-of-state or out-of-country certificate or card 9 that is equivalent to the rules adopted by the commission;

10 (g) Any person who has purchased the boat or vessel within the 11 last ((sixty)) <u>60</u> days, and has a bill of sale in his or her 12 possession to document the date of purchase; <u>and</u>

13 (h) Any person, including those less than ((twelve)) <u>12</u> years of 14 age, who is involved in practicing for, or engaging in, a permitted 15 racing event where a valid document has been issued by the 16 appropriate local, state, or federal government agency for the event, 17 and is available for inspection on-site during the racing event((;

18 (i) Any person who is not yet required to have a boater education 19 card under the phased schedule in RCW 79A.60.630(2)(a); and

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(j) Any person born before January 1, 1955.

21 (4)) (3) Except as provided in subsection ((-3)) (2)(a) through 22 (((i))) (h) of this section, a boater must carry a boater education 23 card <u>or paddle education card</u> while operating a vessel and is 24 required to present the boater education card, or alternative license 25 as provided in subsection ((-3)) (2)(a) and (b) of this section, to 26 a law enforcement officer upon request. <u>The commission shall adopt a</u> 27 digital option for boater education cards and paddle education cards.

((<del>(5)</del>)) <u>(4)</u> Failure to possess a boater education card <u>or a</u> <u>paddle education card</u> required by this section is an infraction under chapter 7.84 RCW. The penalty shall be waived if the boater provides proof to the court within ((<del>sixty</del>)) <u>60</u> days that he or she has received a boater education card.

33 ((<del>(6)</del>)) <u>(5)</u> No person shall permit the rental, charter, or lease 34 of a motor-driven boat or vessel ((with an engine power of fifteen 35 horsepower or greater)) or a human-powered vessel to a person without 36 first reviewing with that person, and all other persons who may be 37 permitted by the person to operate the vessel, all the information 38 contained in the motor vessel safety operating and equipment

- 1 checklist or human-powered vessel safety operating and equipment
- 2 <u>checklist</u>.

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
