AN ACT Relating to the rights of residents in long-term care facilities; amending RCW 70.129.005, 70.129.010, 70.128.125, 18.20.180, 70.97.040, and 18.51.009; and adding new sections to chapter 70.129 RCW.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 70.129.005 and 2020 c 278 s 12 are each amended to 7 read as follows:

(1) The legislature ((recognizes)) finds that ((long-term)):

9 <u>(a) Long-term</u> care facilities are a critical part of the state's 10 long-term care services system((. It is the intent of the legislature 11 that individuals who reside in long-term care facilities receive 12 appropriate services, be treated with courtesy, and continue to enjoy 13 their basic civil and legal rights.

14 It is also the intent of the legislature that long-term care 15 facility residents have the opportunity to exercise reasonable 16 control over life decisions. The legislature finds that choicer));

17 (b) Choice, participation, privacy, and the opportunity to engage 18 in religious, political, civic, recreational, and other social 19 activities foster a sense of self-worth and enhance the quality of 20 life for long-term care residents ((-

13	and residents currently have different rights across all settings
14	which leads to confusion and trauma for residents, providers, and

18	<u>(a) Assure that individuals who reside in long-term care</u>
19	facilities receive appropriate services, be treated with courtesy,
20	continue to enjoy their basic civil and legal rights, and have the
21	opportunity to exercise reasonable control over life decisions;
22	(b) Extend the rights of residents of nursing homes to residents
23	in veterans' homes, assisted living facilities, enhanced services
24	facilities, and adult family homes(($ heta$
25	The legislature intends that a facility should)); and
26	<u>(c) Assure that facilities</u> care for ((its)) <u>their</u> residents in a
27	manner and in an environment that promotes maintenance or enhancement
28	of each resident's quality of life((. A resident should have))_
29	including having a safe, clean, comfortable, and homelike
30	environment, <u>as well as</u> allowing the resident to use ((his or her))
31	personal belongings to the extent possible.
32	NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 70.129
33	RCW to read as follows:
34	The rights guaranteed to residents in nursing facilities by
35	federal law and regulation, 42 U.S.C. Sec. 1396r and 42 C.F.R. Part
36	483, as they existed on the effective date of this section, are

36 483, as they existed on the effective date of this section, are 37 extended to residents in veterans' homes, assisted living facilities, 38 enhanced services facilities, and adult family homes.

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<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 70.129
 RCW to read as follows:

3 The departments shall adopt rules, policies, and standards to 4 further the intent and purposes of this chapter with respect to all 5 long-term care facilities and operators of long-term care facilities.

6 Sec. 4. RCW 70.129.010 and 2021 c 159 s 21 are each amended to 7 read as follows:

8 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in 9 this section apply throughout this chapter.

10 (1) "Chemical restraint" means a psychopharmacologic drug that is 11 used for discipline or convenience and not required to treat the 12 resident's medical symptoms.

13 (2) "Department" means the department of state government 14 responsible for licensing the provider in question.

(3) "Facility" ((means a long-term care facility.

16 (4) "Long-term)) or "long-term care facility" means a facility
17 that is licensed or required to be licensed ((under chapter 18.20,
18 70.97, 72.36, or 70.128)) as:

19 20 (a) An adult family home under chapter 70.128 RCW;

(b) An assisted living facility under chapter 18.20 RCW;

21 (c) An enhanced services facility under chapter 70.97 RCW;

22 (d) A nursing home under chapter 18.51 RCW; or

23 (e) A soldiers' or veterans' home under chapter 72.36 RCW.

((((5))) (4) "Physical restraint" means a manual method, obstacle, or physical or mechanical device, material, or equipment attached or adjacent to the resident's body that restricts freedom of movement or access to his or her body, is used for discipline or convenience, and not required to treat the resident's medical symptoms.

(((6))) <u>(5)</u> "Reasonable accommodation" by a facility to the needs of a prospective or current resident has the meaning given to this term under the federal Americans with disabilities act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. Sec. 12101 et seq. and other applicable federal or state antidiscrimination laws and regulations.

34 (((7))) <u>(6)</u> "Resident" means the individual receiving services in 35 a long-term care facility, that resident's attorney-in-fact, 36 guardian, or other representative acting within the scope of their 37 authority.

38 (((8))) <u>(7)</u> "Resident representative" means:

(a) (i) A court-appointed guardian or conservator of a resident,
 if any;

3 (ii) An individual otherwise authorized by state or federal law 4 including, but not limited to, agents under power of attorney, 5 representative payees, and other fiduciaries, to act on behalf of the 6 resident in order to support the resident in decision making; access 7 medical, social, or other personal information of the resident; 8 manage financial matters; or receive notifications; or

9 (iii) If there is no individual who meets the criteria under 10 (a)(i) or (ii) of this subsection, an individual chosen by the 11 resident to act on behalf of the resident in order to support the 12 resident in decision making; access medical, social, or other 13 personal information of the resident; manage financial matters; or 14 receive notifications.

15 (b) The term "resident representative" does not include any 16 individual described in (a) of this subsection who is affiliated with 17 any long-term care facility or nursing home where the resident 18 resides, or its licensee or management company, unless the affiliated 19 individual is a family member of the resident.
