AN ACT Relating to promoting economic development by increasing opportunities for local communities to secure federal funding; amending RCW 43.330.070, 43.330.088, and 43.330.260; and creating a new section.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that Washington 7 ranks poorly among all states in the amount of federal grants 8 received relative to income taxes collected from its residents.

9 The legislature also finds that many of Washington's communities, 10 particularly in slow-growing rural areas, face an economic 11 development "chicken and egg" dilemma in which they need to secure 12 matching dollars in order to obtain federal economic development 13 dollars that would increase the local tax base, local revenue, and 14 local employment and incomes.

The legislature further finds that recent federal legislation provides funding for economic development clusters that Washington state has invested in as part of its economic development strategy, including broadband and clean energy, buildings, and transportation. The federal legislation includes the infrastructure investment and jobs act, P.L. 117-58, the creating helpful incentives to produce 1 semiconductors and science act, P.L. 117-167, and the inflation 2 reduction act, P.L. 117-169.

3 The legislature further finds that increasing the availability of 4 federal grant dollars in local communities provides a benefit of a 5 reasonably general character to a significant part of the public.

6 Therefore, the legislature intends to continue its efforts to 7 increase the capacity of the department of commerce to assist local 8 communities in successfully applying for federal grant dollars by 9 creating the moving assets towards community health (MATCH) program 10 based on a successful program started in other states that allows 11 local communities to access matching funds that are needed to secure 12 federal grants from a state funding pool.

13 Sec. 2. RCW 43.330.070 and 1993 c 280 s 10 are each amended to 14 read as follows:

15 (1) The department shall work closely with local communities to 16 increase their capacity to respond to economic, environmental, and social problems and challenges. The department shall coordinate the 17 delivery of development services and technical assistance to local 18 communities or regional areas. It shall promote partnerships between 19 20 the public and private sectors and between state and local officials 21 encourage appropriate economic growth and opportunity in to communities throughout the state. The department shall promote 22 appropriate local development by: Supporting the 23 ability of 24 communities to develop and implement strategic development plans; assisting businesses to start up, maintain, or expand their 25 operations; encouraging public infrastructure investment and private 26 27 and public capital investment in local communities; supporting efforts to manage growth and provide affordable housing and housing 28 29 services; providing for the identification and preservation of the 30 state's historical and cultural resources; and expanding employment 31 opportunities.

32 (2) The department shall define a set of services including training and technical assistance that it will make available to 33 local communities, community-based nonprofit organizations, regional 34 areas, or businesses. The department shall simplify access to these 35 programs by providing more centralized and user-friendly information 36 and referral. The department shall coordinate community and economic 37 38 development efforts to minimize program redundancy and maximize 39 accessibility. The department shall develop a set of criteria for

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1 targeting services to local communities. <u>To the extent funding is</u> 2 <u>made available for this specific purpose</u>, the department shall 3 <u>provide technical assistance or enter into contracts to provide</u> 4 <u>technical assistance to assist local communities in developing</u> 5 <u>competitive applications for federal funding.</u>

6 (3) The department shall develop a coordinated and systematic 7 approach to providing training to community-based nonprofit organizations, local communities, and businesses. The approach shall 8 be designed to increase the economic and community development skills 9 available in local communities by providing training and funding for 10 training for local citizens, nonprofit organizations, and businesses. 11 12 department shall emphasize providing training The in those communities most in need of state assistance. 13

14 Sec. 3. RCW 43.330.088 and 2023 c 311 s 2 are each amended to 15 read as follows:

(1) Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this specific purpose, by July 1, 2024, the department shall establish a grant program to support associate development organizations in the recruiting, hiring, and retention of grant writers. The department must award grants on an annual basis and must prioritize grants for distressed areas as defined under RCW 43.168.020 <u>and grants for</u> <u>applications for federal funds</u>.

(2) Associate development organizations must apply for the grantprogram in a manner to be determined by the department.

(3) Associate development organizations that receive awards under this section must provide information on the use of the funds, including a description of the associate development organization's recruiting and hiring efforts and, if applicable, the number and types of grants applied for by the grant writers funded by the state, in their annual reports to the department required under RCW 43.330.082.

32 (4) Beginning December 31, 2026, the department must include 33 information on grant award funding and use in its reports to the 34 legislature on associate development organizations contracts required 35 under RCW 43.330.082.

36 (5) The department shall adopt rules to implement this section.

37 Sec. 4. RCW 43.330.260 and 2006 c 314 s 2 are each amended to 38 read as follows:

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1 (1) The department shall make available, within existing 2 resources, an inventory of grant opportunities for state agencies, 3 local governments, and other community organizations engaged in 4 economic development activities.

5 (2) In developing the inventory of economic development grant 6 opportunities, the department may:

7 (a) Regularly review the federal register for opportunities to
8 apply for grants, research projects, and demonstration projects;

9 (b) Maintain an inventory of grant opportunities with private 10 foundations and businesses; ((and))

(c) <u>Provide a resource guide for applicants for federal grants,</u> including links to federal applications and relevant resources, and <u>contact information for department assistance; and</u>

14 <u>(d)</u> Consult with federal officials, including but not limited to 15 those in the small business administration, the department of labor, 16 the department of commerce, the department of agriculture, the 17 department of ecology, as well as private foundations and businesses, 18 on the prospects for obtaining federal and private funds for economic 19 development purposes in Washington state.

20 (3) The department may also facilitate joint efforts between 21 agencies and between local organizations and state agencies that will 22 increase the likelihood of success in grant seeking and the 23 attraction of major events.

24 <u>(4) The department shall establish and administer a moving assets</u> 25 <u>towards community health program. The purpose of the program is to</u> 26 <u>increase opportunities for local communities to compete for federal</u> 27 <u>grants by providing a state pool of matching funds that eligible</u> 28 <u>entities can access in the application process.</u>

29 (a) The department may adopt rules to create and implement the 30 program.

31 (b) Beginning December 31, 2027, the department must report on 32 the program. The report shall be updated every two years and posted on the department's website and transmitted to the governor and the 33 legislature. The report must identify the federal funds awarded to 34 entities in receipt of moving assets towards community health program 35 funds, describe efforts made to assist local communities with 36 obtaining federal economic development funds, identify all federally 37 awarded applicants and projects for the preceding two years, and 38 39 contain an analysis of program effectiveness based on performance

- 1 measurement requirements, including the amount of federal dollars
- 2 <u>obtained relative to the amount of state dollars expended.</u>

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
