1 AN ACT Relating to access to midwifery and doula services for 2 incarcerated women; adding a new section to chapter 72.09 RCW; and 3 adding a new section to chapter 70.48 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 72.09 6 RCW to read as follows:

(1) The department must make reasonable accommodations for the 7 provision of available doula services to inmates who are pregnant or 8 who have given birth in the last six weeks. Persons providing doula 9 10 services must be granted appropriate facility access, must be allowed 11 to attend and provide assistance during labor and childbirth where feasible, and must have access to the inmate's relevant health care 12 information, as defined in RCW 70.02.010, if the inmate authorizes 13 14 disclosure.

15 (2) For purposes of this section, "doula services" are services 16 provided by a trained doula and designed to provide physical, 17 emotional, or informational support to a pregnant woman before, 18 during, and after delivery of a child. Doula services may include, 19 but are not limited to: Support and assistance during labor and 20 childbirth; prenatal and postpartum education; breastfeeding 1 assistance; parenting education; and support in the event that a
2 woman has been or will become separated from her child.

3 (3) Nothing in this section requires the department to establish 4 or provide funding for doula services, or prevents the department 5 from adopting policy guidelines for the delivery of doula services to 6 inmates.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 70.48 8 RCW to read as follows:

(1) Jails must make reasonable accommodations for the provision 9 10 of available doula services to inmates who are pregnant or who have given birth in the last six weeks. Persons providing doula services 11 12 must be granted appropriate facility access, must be allowed to attend and provide assistance during labor and childbirth where 13 feasible, and must have access to the inmate's relevant health care 14 15 information, as defined in RCW 70.02.010, if the inmate authorizes 16 disclosure.

(2) For purposes of this section, "doula services" are services 17 provided by a trained doula and designed to provide physical, 18 emotional, or informational support to a pregnant woman before, 19 20 during, and after delivery of a child. Doula services may include, but are not limited to: Support and assistance during labor and 21 22 childbirth; prenatal and postpartum education; breastfeeding 23 assistance; parenting education; and support in the event that a 24 woman has been or will become separated from her child.

(3) Nothing in this section requires governing units to establish
 or provide funding for doula services, or prevents the adoption of
 policy guidelines for the delivery of doula services to inmates.
