## HOUSE BILL 2086

State of Washington 65th Legislature 2017 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to establishing a task force to address state 2 interagency coordination in cybersecurity; creating a new section; 3 and providing an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

(1) The office of the state chief 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 6 information officer and the military department shall convene a task force to address the coordination of cybersecurity and emergency 7 management activities by state agencies. Task force membership must 8 include, but not be limited to, representatives from the military 9 10 department, the office of cybersecurity within the office of the state chief information officer, and representatives of state 11 agencies responsible for information technology systems supporting 12 essential government functions. The state chief information officer 13 14 and the director of the military department shall serve as cochairs of the task force. 15

16 (2) The task force shall review issues including, but not limited 17 to, the following:

(a) Information technology security incidents that could trigger
state disaster recovery efforts and the execution of continuity of
operations plans;

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(b) Information technology systems, services, and requirements
that support essential functions as defined by agencies' continuity
of operations planning;

4 (c) Roles and responsibilities of state agencies in the event of 5 a significant cybersecurity incident; and

6 (d) Coordination of emergency management and cybersecurity 7 functions in continuity of operations planning and incident response.

8 (3) The task force must publish notice of the date, time, 9 location, and subject of any official meetings and provide such 10 information directly to the technology services board and the 11 appropriate committees of both chambers of the legislature no later 12 than one week before the meeting is scheduled to take place.

(4) Staff support for and expenses of the task force shall beprovided by the office of the state chief information officer.

15 (5) In compliance with RCW 43.01.036, the office of the state 16 chief information officer must submit a report detailing the 17 recommendations of the task force to the appropriate committees of 18 both houses of the legislature and the governor by December 12, 2018. 19 (6) This section expires June 30, 2019.

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
