AN ACT Relating to bump-fire stock buy-back program records; amending RCW 42.56.230 and 42.56.230; providing an effective date; providing an expiration date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 42.56.230 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 6 s 222 are each 6 amended to read as follows:

7 The following personal information is exempt from public 8 inspection and copying under this chapter:

9 (1) Personal information in any files maintained for students in 10 public schools, patients or clients of public institutions or public 11 health agencies, or welfare recipients;

(2)(a) Personal information:

(i) For a child enrolled in licensed child care in any filesmaintained by the department of children, youth, and families;

(ii) For a child enrolled in a public or nonprofit program serving or pertaining to children, adolescents, or students, including but not limited to early learning or child care services, parks and recreation programs, youth development programs, and afterschool programs; or

20 (iii) For the family members or guardians of a child who is 21 subject to the exemption under this subsection (2) if the family

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1 member or guardian has the same last name as the child or if the 2 family member or guardian resides at the same address as the child 3 and disclosure of the family member's or guardian's information would 4 result in disclosure of the personal information exempted under 5 (a) (i) and (ii) of this subsection.

6 (b) Emergency contact information under this subsection (2) may 7 be provided to appropriate authorities and medical personnel for the 8 purpose of treating the individual during an emergency situation;

9 (3) Personal information in files maintained for employees, 10 appointees, or elected officials of any public agency to the extent 11 that disclosure would violate their right to privacy;

(4) Information required of any taxpayer in connection with the assessment or collection of any tax if the disclosure of the information to other persons would: (a) Be prohibited to such persons by RCW 84.08.210, 82.32.330, 84.40.020, 84.40.340, or any ordinance authorized under RCW 35.102.145; or (b) violate the taxpayer's right to privacy or result in unfair competitive disadvantage to the taxpayer;

(5) Credit card numbers, debit card numbers, electronic check numbers, card expiration dates, or bank or other financial information as defined in RCW 9.35.005 including social security numbers, except when disclosure is expressly required by or governed by other law;

(6) Personal and financial information related to a small loan orany system of authorizing a small loan in RCW 31.45.093;

(7) (a) Any record used to prove identity, age, residential
address, social security number, or other personal information
required to apply for a driver's license or identicard.

(b) Information provided under RCW 46.20.111 that indicates thatan applicant declined to register with the selective service system.

31 (c) Any record pertaining to a vehicle license plate, driver's 32 license, or identicard issued under RCW 46.08.066 that, alone or in 33 combination with any other records, may reveal the identity of an individual, or reveal that an individual is or was, performing an 34 undercover or covert law enforcement, confidential public health 35 work, public assistance fraud, or child support investigative 36 activity. This exemption does not prevent the release of the total 37 number of vehicle license plates, drivers' licenses, or identicards 38 39 that, under RCW 46.08.066, an agency or department has applied for,

1 been issued, denied, returned, destroyed, lost, and reported for 2 misuse.

(d) Any record pertaining to a vessel registration issued under 3 RCW 88.02.330 that, alone or in combination with any other records, 4 may reveal the identity of an individual, or reveal that an 5 6 individual is or was, performing an undercover or covert law enforcement activity. This exemption does not prevent the release of 7 the total number of vessel registrations that, under RCW 88.02.330, 8 an agency or department has applied for, been issued, denied, 9 returned, destroyed, lost, and reported for misuse; 10

(8) All information related to individual claims resolution structured settlement agreements submitted to the board of industrial insurance appeals under RCW 51.04.063, other than final orders from the board of industrial insurance appeals.

Upon request by the legislature, the department of licensing shall provide a report to the legislature containing all of the information in subsection (7)(c) and (d) of this section that is subject to public disclosure; ((and))

(9) Voluntarily submitted information contained in a database that is part of or associated with enhanced 911 emergency communications systems, or information contained or used in emergency notification systems as provided under RCW 38.52.575 and 38.52.577; and

The following personal information is exempt from public inspection and copying under this chapter:

31 (1) Personal information in any files maintained for students in 32 public schools, patients or clients of public institutions or public 33 health agencies, or welfare recipients;

34 (2)(a) Personal information:

35 (i) For a child enrolled in licensed child care in any files 36 maintained by the department of children, youth, and families;

(ii) For a child enrolled in a public or nonprofit program
 serving or pertaining to children, adolescents, or students,
 including but not limited to early learning or child care services,

1 parks and recreation programs, youth development programs, and after-2 school programs; or

3 (iii) For the family members or guardians of a child who is 4 subject to the exemption under this subsection (2) if the family 5 member or guardian has the same last name as the child or if the 6 family member or guardian resides at the same address as the child 7 and disclosure of the family member's or guardian's information would 8 result in disclosure of the personal information exempted under 9 (a) (i) and (ii) of this subsection.

10 (b) Emergency contact information under this subsection (2) may 11 be provided to appropriate authorities and medical personnel for the 12 purpose of treating the individual during an emergency situation;

13 (3) Personal information in files maintained for employees, 14 appointees, or elected officials of any public agency to the extent 15 that disclosure would violate their right to privacy;

(4) Information required of any taxpayer in connection with the assessment or collection of any tax if the disclosure of the information to other persons would: (a) Be prohibited to such persons by RCW 84.08.210, 82.32.330, 84.40.020, 84.40.340, or any ordinance authorized under RCW 35.102.145; or (b) violate the taxpayer's right to privacy or result in unfair competitive disadvantage to the taxpayer;

(5) Credit card numbers, debit card numbers, electronic check numbers, card expiration dates, or bank or other financial information as defined in RCW 9.35.005 including social security numbers, except when disclosure is expressly required by or governed by other law;

(6) Personal and financial information related to a small loan or any system of authorizing a small loan in RCW 31.45.093;

30 (7)(a) Any record used to prove identity, age, residential 31 address, social security number, or other personal information 32 required to apply for a driver's license or identicard.

33 (b) Information provided under RCW 46.20.111 that indicates that 34 an applicant declined to register with the selective service system.

35 (c) Any record pertaining to a vehicle license plate, driver's 36 license, or identicard issued under RCW 46.08.066 that, alone or in 37 combination with any other records, may reveal the identity of an 38 individual, or reveal that an individual is or was, performing an 39 undercover or covert law enforcement, confidential public health 40 work, public assistance fraud, or child support investigative

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1 activity. This exemption does not prevent the release of the total 2 number of vehicle license plates, drivers' licenses, or identicards 3 that, under RCW 46.08.066, an agency or department has applied for, 4 been issued, denied, returned, destroyed, lost, and reported for 5 misuse.

6 (d) Any record pertaining to a vessel registration issued under 7 RCW 88.02.330 that, alone or in combination with any other records, may reveal the identity of an individual, or reveal that 8 an 9 individual is or was, performing an undercover or covert law enforcement activity. This exemption does not prevent the release of 10 11 the total number of vessel registrations that, under RCW 88.02.330, 12 an agency or department has applied for, been issued, denied, returned, destroyed, lost, and reported for misuse; 13

14 (8) All information related to individual claims resolution 15 structured settlement agreements submitted to the board of industrial 16 insurance appeals under RCW 51.04.063, other than final orders from 17 the board of industrial insurance appeals.

18 Upon request by the legislature, the department of licensing 19 shall provide a report to the legislature containing all of the 20 information in subsection (7)(c) and (d) of this section that is 21 subject to public disclosure;

(9) Voluntarily submitted information contained in a database that is part of or associated with enhanced 911 emergency communications systems, or information contained or used in emergency notification systems as provided under RCW 38.52.575 and 38.52.577; ((and))

(10) Until the person reaches eighteen years of age, information, otherwise disclosable under chapter 29A.08 RCW, that relates to a future voter, except for the purpose of processing and delivering ballots; and

31 <u>(11) Names, addresses, or other personal information of</u> 32 <u>individuals who participated in the bump-fire stock buy-back program</u> 33 <u>under RCW 43.43.920</u>.

34 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. (1) Section 1 of this act expires July 1, 35 2019.

36 (2) Section 2 of this act takes effect July 1, 2019.

37 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. This act is necessary for the immediate 38 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of

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- 1 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes
- 2 effect immediately.

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
