AN ACT Relating to strengthening the early learning facilities grant and loan program by revising criteria and providing resources to the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities development account; amending RCW 43.31.577 and 43.31.575; adding a new section to chapter 43.31 RCW; and providing an effective date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 Sec. 1. RCW 43.31.577 and 2023 c 474 s 8031 are each amended to 8 read as follows:

9 (1) Activities eligible for funding through the early learning 10 facilities grant and loan program for eligible organizations include:

11 Facility predesign grants or loans ((of no more than (a) 12 \$20,000)) to allow eligible organizations to secure professional 13 services or consult with organizations certified by the community 14 development financial institutions fund to plan for and assess the feasibility of early learning facilities projects or receive other 15 16 technical assistance to design and develop projects for construction 17 funding;

(b) Grants or loans ((of no more than \$200,000 for minor renovations or repairs of existing early learning facilities or)) for predevelopment activities to advance a proposal from planning to major construction or renovation;

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1 (c) <u>Grants or loans for renovations or repairs of existing early</u>
2 <u>learning facilities;</u>

<u>(d)</u> Major construction and renovation grants or loans and grants or loans for facility purchases ((of no more than \$1,000,000)) to create or expand early learning facilities((, except that during the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium these grants or loans may not exceed \$2,500,000)); and

8 (((d))) <u>(e)</u> Administration costs associated with conducting 9 application processes, managing contracts, <u>translation services</u>, and 10 providing technical assistance.

11 (2) For grants or loans awarded under subsection (1)(c) and (d) 12 of this section, the department must prioritize applications for 13 facilities that are ready for construction.

14 <u>(3)</u> Activities eligible for funding through the early learning 15 facilities grant and loan program for school districts include major 16 construction, purchase, and renovation grants or loans ((of no more 17 than \$1,000,000)) to create or expand early learning facilities that 18 received priority and ranking as described in RCW 43.31.581.

19 (((3) Amounts in this section must be increased annually by the 20 United States implicit price deflator for state and local government 21 construction provided by the office of financial management.))

22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 43.31 23 RCW to read as follows:

24 For early learning facilities collocated with affordable or supportive housing developments, the department may remit state 25 funding on a reimbursement basis for 90 percent of eligible project 26 27 costs, regardless of the project's match amount, once the nonstate share of project costs have been either expended or firmly committed 28 in an amount sufficient to complete the entire project or a distinct 29 30 phase of the project that is useable to the public as an early 31 learning facility. Eligible housing developments are projects that have received public funding and have secured enough funding to 32 complete construction of the project that will result in a 33 certificate of occupancy to open the affordable housing development, 34 35 including the early learning facility.

36 Sec. 3. RCW 43.31.575 and 2021 c 130 s 2 are each amended to 37 read as follows:

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1 (1) Organizations eligible to receive funding from the early 2 learning facilities grant and loan program include:

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(a) Early childhood education and assistance program providers;

4 (b) Working connections child care providers who are eligible to 5 receive state subsidies;

6 (c) Licensed early learning centers not currently participating 7 in the early childhood education and assistance program, but 8 intending to do so;

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(d) Developers of housing and community facilities;

10 (e) Community and technical colleges;

11 (f) Educational service districts;

12 (g) Local governments;

13 (h) Federally recognized tribes in the state; and

14 (i) Religiously affiliated entities.

15 (2) To be eligible to receive funding from the early learning 16 facilities grant and loan program for activities described in RCW 17 43.31.577 (1) (b), (c), and (((-))) (d) and (2), eligible 18 organizations and school districts must:

(a) Commit to being an active participant in good standing withthe early achievers program as defined by chapter 43.216 RCW; and

(b) Demonstrate that projects receiving construction, purchase,or renovation grants or loans must also:

(i) Demonstrate that the project site is under the applicant's control for a minimum of ten years, either through ownership or a long-term lease; and

(ii) Commit to using the facility funded by the grant or loan for the purposes of providing preschool or child care for a minimum of ten years.

(3) To be eligible to receive funding from the early learning facilities grant and loan program for activities described in RCW 43.31.577 (1) (b), (c), and (((-+))) (d) and (2), religiously affiliated entities must use the facility to provide child care and education services consistent with subsection (4)(a) of this section.

34 (4)(a) Upon receiving a grant or loan, the recipient must 35 continue to be an active participant and in good standing with the 36 early achievers program.

37 (b) If the recipient does not meet the conditions specified in 38 (a) of this subsection, the grants shall be repaid to the early 39 learning facilities revolving account or the early learning 40 facilities development account, as directed by the department. So long as an eligible organization continues to provide an early learning program in the facility, the facility is used as authorized, and the eligible organization continues to be an active participant and in good standing with the early achievers program, the grant repayment is waived.

6 (c) The department, in consultation with the department of 7 children, youth, and families, ((must)) <u>may</u> adopt rules to implement 8 this section.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. If any provision of this act or its 10 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 11 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 12 persons or circumstances is not affected.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. Section 1 of this act takes effect July 1, 14 2025.

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
