AN ACT Relating to the creation of the legislative budget office 1 2 to provide fiscal notes on proposed legislation; amending RCW 29A.72.025, 3 2.56.120, 28A.300.0401, 43.41.110, 43.88A.020, 43.88A.040, 43.132.020, 43.132.030, 43.132.040, 4 43.88A.030, 43.132.050, and 43.132.810; reenacting and amending RCW 44.04.260; 5 6 adding a new chapter to Title 44 RCW; and creating a new section.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that Article II, 8 section 1 of the state Constitution vests the legislative authority 9 10 of the state of Washington in the legislature. Additionally, the legislature finds that a conflict of interest exists when the fiscal 11 12 impact of proposed legislation is provided by an executive agency 13 created under the office of the governor and the proposed legislation would restrict or limit the powers of the executive branch. 14 15 Accordingly, the legislature finds that the analysis of any 16 associated costs of proposed legislation rightfully belongs within a 17 nonpartisan office of the legislative branch. Therefore, the legislature intends to create a nonpartisan legislative budget office 18 19 to provide fiscal notes for proposed legislation and provide 20 legislative fiscal analysis performed by the oversight of the executive branch. 21

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The legislative budget office is created 2 as a nonpartisan agency within the legislative branch. The executive 3 head of the office is the legislative budget director, who must be 4 qualified by education and experience in the fields of finance and 5 government.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. (1) The legislative budget director 7 appointment committee is created. The committee consists of:

8 (a) The chair and ranking minority member of the house of 9 representatives appropriations committee; and

10 (b) The chair and ranking minority member of the senate ways and 11 means committee.

12 (2) The legislative budget director appointment committee is 13 jointly chaired by the chair of the house of representatives 14 appropriations committee and the chair of the senate ways and means 15 committee.

16 (3) The legislative budget director appointment committee shall 17 appoint or remove the legislative budget director by at least a 18 three-fourths vote of the committee. When considering the appointment 19 or removal of the legislative budget director, the appointment 20 committee must consult with the chief clerk of the house of 21 representatives, the secretary of the senate, and other interested 22 parties.

(4) The legislative budget director appointment committee must be convened by the chairs of the house of representatives appropriations committee and the senate ways and means committee:

26 (a) Whenever the position of legislative budget director becomes27 vacant; or

28 (b) Upon the written request of any two members of the 29 appointment committee.

30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. The legislative budget director has the 31 authority to select and employ such research, technical, and clerical 32 personnel and consultants as the director deems necessary, whose 33 salaries are fixed by the director and approved by the legislative 34 budget director appointment committee, and who are exempt from the 35 provisions of the state civil service law, chapter 41.06 RCW.

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. The legislative budget office has the 2 power and duty to provide fiscal notes depicting the expected fiscal 3 impact of proposed legislation in accordance with chapter 43.88A RCW.

4 Sec. 6. RCW 2.56.120 and 2005 c 282 s 8 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) The administrative office of the courts, in cooperation with appropriate legislative committees and legislative staff, shall 7 establish a procedure for the provision of judicial impact notes on 8 effect legislative bills will have on the workload and 9 the administration of the courts of this state. The administrative office 10 11 of the courts and the ((office of financial management)) legislative budget office shall coordinate the development of judicial impact 12 13 notes with the preparation of fiscal notes under chapters 43.88A and 43.132 RCW. 14

15 (2) The administrative office of the courts shall provide a 16 judicial impact note on any legislative proposal at the request of 17 any legislator. The note shall be provided to the requesting 18 legislator and copies filed with the appropriate legislative 19 committees in accordance with subsection (3) of this section when the 20 proposed legislation is introduced in either house.

(3) When a judicial impact note is prepared and approved by the administrative office of the courts, copies of the note shall be filed with:

(a) The chairperson of the committee to which the bill wasreferred upon introduction in the house of origin;

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(b) The senate committee on ways and means;

27 (c) The house of representatives committee on ways and means;

(d) The senate judiciary committee;

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(e) The house of representatives judiciary committee; and

30 (f) The ((office of financial management)) legislative budget
31 office.

This section shall not 32 (4) prevent either house of the legislature from acting on any bill before it as otherwise provided 33 by the state Constitution, by law, and by the rules and joint rules 34 35 of the senate and house of representatives, nor shall the lack of any judicial impact note as provided in this section or any error in the 36 accuracy thereof affect the validity of any measure otherwise duly 37 38 passed by the legislature.

1 Sec. 7. RCW 28A.300.0401 and 2011 c 140 s 3 are each amended to 2 read as follows:

(1) The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall, 3 where it is practicable to do so within available resources, prepare 4 school district fiscal notes on proposed legislation that increases 5 6 or decreases, or tends to increase or decrease, school district revenues or expenditures in a manner that uniquely affects school 7 districts. Proposed legislation that uniquely affects school 8 districts includes, but is not limited to, legislation that affects 9 school districts' responsibilities as providers of educational 10 services under this title, as employers under chapter 41.59 RCW, or 11 12 as excess levy taxing authorities under RCW 84.52.053 and 84.52.0531, but excludes proposed legislation that affects school districts only 13 in the same manner that it affects other units of local government. 14

15 (2) Where practicable, the school district fiscal note shall show 16 the fiscal impact of the proposed legislation on each school 17 district. Where it is not practicable to do so, the school district 18 fiscal note shall show the effect of the legislation on a range of 19 representative school districts. The fiscal note must set forth any 20 assumptions that were used in selecting the representative districts, 21 along with any other assumptions made about the fiscal impact.

(3) School district fiscal notes prepared under this section are
 subject to coordination by the ((office of financial management))
 <u>legislative budget office</u> under RCW 43.88A.020 and are otherwise
 subject to the requirements and procedures of chapter 43.88A RCW.

26 Sec. 8. RCW 29A.72.025 and 2009 c 415 s 7 are each amended to 27 read as follows:

28 The ((office of financial management)) legislative budget office, 29 in consultation with the secretary of state, the attorney general, 30 and any other appropriate state or local agency, shall prepare a 31 fiscal impact statement for each of the following state ballot measures: (1) An initiative to the people that is certified to the 32 ballot; (2) an initiative to the legislature that will appear on the 33 ballot; (3) an alternative measure appearing on the ballot that the 34 legislature proposes to an initiative to the legislature; (4) a 35 referendum bill referred to voters by the legislature; and (5) a 36 referendum measure appearing on the ballot. Fiscal impact statements 37 38 must be written in clear and concise language, avoid legal and technical terms when possible, and be filed with the secretary of 39

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state no later than the tenth day of August. Fiscal impact statements
 may include easily understood graphics.

A fiscal impact statement must describe any projected increase or 3 decrease in revenues, costs, expenditures, or indebtedness that the 4 state or local governments will experience if the ballot measure were 5 6 approved by state voters. Where appropriate, a fiscal impact statement may include both estimated dollar amounts and a description 7 placing the estimated dollar amounts into context. A fiscal impact 8 statement must include both a summary of not to exceed one hundred 9 words and a more detailed statement that includes the assumptions 10 11 that were made to develop the fiscal impacts.

Fiscal impact statements must be available online from the secretary of state's web site and included in the state voters' pamphlet. Additional information may be posted on the web site of the ((office of financial management)) legislative budget office.

16 **Sec. 9.** RCW 43.41.110 and 2011 1st sp.s. c 43 s 510 are each 17 amended to read as follows:

18 The office of financial management shall:

(1) Provide technical assistance to the governor and the
 legislature in identifying needs and in planning to meet those needs
 through state programs and a plan for expenditures.

(2) Perform the comprehensive planning functions and processes necessary or advisable for state program planning and development, preparation of the budget, inter-departmental and inter-governmental coordination and cooperation, and determination of state capital improvement requirements.

(3) Provide assistance and coordination to state agencies anddepartments in their preparation of plans and programs.

(4) Provide general coordination and review of plans in
 functional areas of state government as may be necessary for receipt
 of federal or state funds.

32 (5) Participate with other states or subdivisions thereof in 33 interstate planning.

34 (6) Encourage educational and research programs that further35 planning and provide administrative and technical services therefor.

36 (7) Carry out the provisions of RCW 43.62.010 through 43.62.05037 relating to the state census.

38 (8) Be the official state participant in the federal-state39 cooperative program for local population estimates and as such

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certify all city and county special censuses to be considered in the
 allocation of state and federal revenues.

3 (9) Be the official state center for processing and dissemination
4 of federal decennial or quinquennial census data in cooperation with
5 other state agencies.

6 (10) Be the official state agency certifying annexations, 7 incorporations, or disincorporations to the United States bureau of 8 the census.

9 (11) Review all United States bureau of the census population 10 estimates used for federal revenue sharing purposes and provide a 11 liaison for local governments with the United States bureau of the 12 census in adjusting or correcting revenue sharing population 13 estimates.

14 (12) ((Provide fiscal notes depicting the expected fiscal impact 15 of proposed legislation in accordance with chapter 43.88A RCW.

16 (13)) Be the official state agency to estimate and manage the 17 cash flow of all public funds as provided in chapter 43.88 RCW. To 18 this end, the office shall adopt such rules as are necessary to 19 manage the cash flow of public funds.

20 Sec. 10. RCW 43.88A.020 and 2011 c 140 s 1 are each amended to 21 read as follows:

22 The ((office of financial management)) legislative budget office shall, in cooperation with appropriate legislative committees and 23 24 legislative staff, establish a procedure for the provision of fiscal notes on the expected impact of bills and resolutions which increase 25 or decrease or tend to increase or decrease state government revenues 26 27 or expenditures. Such fiscal notes shall indicate by fiscal year the impact for the remainder of the biennium in which the bill or 28 resolution will first take effect as well as a cumulative forecast of 29 30 the fiscal impact for the succeeding four fiscal years. Fiscal notes 31 shall separately identify the fiscal impacts on the operating and capital budgets. Estimates of fiscal impacts shall be calculated 32 using the procedures contained in the fiscal note instructions issued 33 by the ((office of financial management)) legislative budget office. 34

In establishing the fiscal impact called for pursuant to this chapter, the ((office of financial management)) legislative budget office shall coordinate the development of fiscal notes with all state agencies affected.

1 The preparation and dissemination of the ongoing cost projections 2 and other requirements of RCW 43.135.031 for bills increasing taxes 3 or fees shall take precedence over fiscal notes.

For proposed legislation that uniquely affects school districts, in addition to any fiscal note prepared under this chapter, a school district fiscal note must be prepared under the process established in RCW 28A.300.0401.

8 Sec. 11. RCW 43.88A.030 and 2008 c 1 s 4 are each amended to 9 read as follows:

10 When a fiscal note is prepared and approved as to form, accuracy, 11 and completeness by the ((office of financial management)) 12 <u>legislative budget office</u>, which depicts the expected fiscal impact 13 of a bill or resolution, copies shall be filed immediately with:

14 (1) The chairperson of the committee to which the bill or15 resolution was referred upon introduction in the house of origin;

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(2) The senate committee on ways and means, or its successor; and

17 (3) The house committees on revenue and appropriations, or their 18 successors.

Whenever possible, such fiscal note and, in the case of a bill increasing taxes or fees, the cost projection and other information required under RCW 43.135.031 shall be provided prior to or at the time the bill or resolution is first heard by the committee of reference in the house of origin.

When a fiscal note has been prepared for a bill or resolution, a 24 25 copy of the fiscal note shall be placed in the bill books or otherwise attached to the bill or resolution and shall remain with 26 27 the bill or resolution throughout the legislative process insofar as possible. For bills increasing taxes or fees, the cost projection and 28 other information required by RCW 43.135.031 shall be placed in the 29 30 bill books or otherwise attached to the bill or resolution and shall 31 remain with the bill or resolution throughout the legislative process insofar as possible. 32

33 Sec. 12. RCW 43.88A.040 and 1979 c 151 s 148 are each amended to 34 read as follows:

35 The ((office of financial management)) legislative budget office 36 shall also provide a fiscal note on any legislative proposal at the 37 request of any legislator. Such fiscal note shall be returned to the 38 requesting legislator, and copies shall be filed with the appropriate 1 legislative committees pursuant to RCW 43.88A.030 at the time such 2 proposed legislation is introduced in either house.

3 Sec. 13. RCW 43.132.020 and 2011 c 140 s 2 are each amended to 4 read as follows:

5 The ((director of financial management)) legislative budget director or the director's designee shall, in cooperation with 6 7 appropriate legislative committees and legislative staff, establish a mechanism for the determination of the fiscal impact of proposed 8 9 legislation which if enacted into law would directly or indirectly increase or decrease revenues received or expenditures incurred by 10 11 counties, cities, towns, or any other units of local government. For purposes of this section, "unit of local government" includes school 12 districts to the extent that the proposed legislation affects school 13 districts in the same manner as it affects other units of local 14 15 government. Where proposed legislation uniquely affects school 16 districts, a school district fiscal note must be prepared under the process established in RCW 28A.300.0401. The ((office of financial 17 management)) legislative budget office shall, when requested by a 18 member of the state legislature, report in writing as to such fiscal 19 impact and said report shall be known as a "fiscal note". 20

Such fiscal notes shall indicate by fiscal year the total impact on the local governments involved for the first two years the legislation would be in effect and also a cumulative six year forecast of the fiscal impact. Where feasible and applicable, the fiscal note also shall indicate the fiscal impact on each individual county or on a representative sampling of cities, towns, or other units of local government.

A fiscal note as defined in this section shall be provided only 28 upon request of any member of the state legislature. A request for a 29 30 fiscal note on legislation shall be considered to be a continuing request for a fiscal note on any formal alteration of the legislation 31 in the form of amendments to the legislation that are adopted by a 32 committee or a house of the legislature or a substitute version of 33 such legislation that is adopted by a committee and preparation of 34 the fiscal note on the prior version of the legislation shall stop, 35 unless the legislator requesting the fiscal note specifies otherwise 36 or the altered version is first adopted or enacted in the last week 37 38 of a legislative session.

1 Fiscal notes shall be completed within one week of the request unless a longer time period is allowed by the requesting legislator. 2 In the event a fiscal note has not been completed within one week of 3 a request, a daily report shall be prepared for the requesting 4 legislator by the ((director of financial management which report)) 5 6 legislative budget director that summarizes the progress in preparing 7 the fiscal note. If the request is referred to the director of commerce, the daily report shall also include the date and time such 8 referral was made. 9

10 Sec. 14. RCW 43.132.030 and 1995 c 399 s 80 are each amended to 11 read as follows:

12 The ((director of financial management)) legislative budget 13 <u>director</u> is hereby empowered to designate the director of ((community, trade, and economic development)) the department of 14 15 commerce as the official responsible for the preparation of fiscal 16 notes authorized and required by this chapter. It is the intent of 17 the legislature that when necessary the resources of other state 18 agencies, appropriate legislative staffs, and various the associations of local government may be employed in the development 19 20 of such fiscal notes.

21 Sec. 15. RCW 43.132.040 and 2000 c 182 s 3 are each amended to 22 read as follows:

23 When a fiscal note is prepared and approved as to form and 24 completeness by the ((director of financial management)) legislative 25 budget director, the director shall transmit copies immediately to:

The requesting legislator;

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(2) With respect to proposed legislation held by the senate, the chairperson of the committee which holds or has acted upon the proposed legislation, the chairperson of the ways and means committee or equivalent committees with jurisdiction over matters normally considered by a ways and means committee, the chairperson of the local government committee or equivalent committee that considers local government matters, and the secretary of the senate; and

34 (3) With respect to proposed legislation held by the house of 35 representatives, the chairperson of the committee which holds or has 36 acted upon the proposed legislation, the chairpersons of the ways and 37 means committee or equivalent committees with jurisdiction over 38 matters normally considered by a ways and means committee, the 1 chairperson of the local government committee or equivalent committee 2 that considers local government matters, and the chief clerk of the 3 house of representatives.

4 Sec. 16. RCW 43.132.050 and 1986 c 158 s 19 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 The ((office of financial management)) legislative budget office 7 may make additional copies of the fiscal note available to members of 8 the legislature and others on request.

9 At the request of any member of the senate or house of 10 representatives, whichever is considering the proposed legislation, 11 and unless it is prohibited by the rules of the body, copies of the 12 fiscal note or a synopsis thereof shall be placed on the members' 13 desks at the time the proposed legislation takes its place on the 14 second reading calendar.

15 Whenever proposed legislation accompanied by such a fiscal note 16 is passed by either the senate or the house of representatives, the 17 fiscal note shall be transmitted with the bill to the other house.

18 Sec. 17. RCW 43.132.810 and 2000 c 182 s 6 are each amended to 19 read as follows:

The ((office of financial management)) legislative budget office, in consultation with the department of ((community, trade, and economic development)) commerce, shall prepare a report for the legislature on or before December 31st of every even-numbered year on local government fiscal notes, and reports on the fiscal impacts on local governments arising from selected laws, that were prepared over the preceding two-year period.

27 Sec. 18. RCW 44.04.260 and 2012 c 229 s 204 and 2012 c 113 s 6 28 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

29 The joint legislative audit and review committee, the joint transportation committee, the select committee on pension policy, the 30 legislative evaluation and accountability program committee, the 31 office of legislative support services, the joint higher education 32 legislative budget office, and the joint legislative 33 committee, systems committee are subject to such operational policies, 34 procedures, and oversight as are deemed necessary by the facilities 35 36 and operations committee of the senate and the executive rules committee of the house of representatives to ensure operational 37

1 adequacy of the agencies of the legislative branch. As used in this section, "operational policies, procedures, and oversight" includes 2 the development process of biennial budgets, contracting procedures, 3 personnel policies, and compensation plans, selection of a chief 4 administrator, facilities, and expenditures. This section does not 5 6 grant oversight authority to the facilities and operations committee of the senate over any standing committee of the house of 7 representatives or oversight authority to the executive rules 8 committee of the house of representatives over any standing committee 9 of the senate. 10

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 19. Sections 2 through 5 of this act 12 constitute a new chapter in Title 44 RCW.

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
