- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.112.020 and 2006 c 338 s 8 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- (1) This chapter shall be administered by the director or his or 6 7 her authorized agent. For the purpose of administering this chapter, for motor fuel except biodiesel fuel, the standards set forth in the 9 Annual Book of ASTM Standards and supplements thereto, and revisions thereof, are adopted, together with applicable federal environmental 10 protection agency standards. If a conflict exists between federal 11 environmental protection agency standards, ASTM standards, or state 12 13 standards, for purposes of uniformity, federal environmental protection 14 agency standards shall take precedence over ASTM standards. 15 standards adopted must be consistent with federal environmental 16 protection agency standards and ASTM standards not in conflict with
- 18 (2) The director may establish a fuel testing laboratory or may contract with a laboratory for testing. The director may also adopt 19

federal environmental protection agency standards.

rules on false and misleading advertising, labeling and posting of 1 2 prices, and the standards for, and identity of, motor fuels. director shall require fuel pumps offering ((biodiesel and)) an ethanol 3 blend((s)) to be identified by a label stating the percentage of 4 ((biodiesel or)) ethanol and fuel pumps offering a biodiesel blend of 5 up to and including five percent to be identified by a label that 6 states "may contain up to five percent biodiesel." Biodiesel blends 7 above five percent shall be identified by a label stating the 8 percentage of biodiesel being offered. 9

(3) The rules adopted under RCW 19.112.140 shall also provide that the diesel refiner is responsible for meeting the ASTM standards required by chapter 338, Laws of 2006 when providing diesel fuel into the distribution system.
