SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2691

State of Washington 64th Legislature 2016 Regular Session

By House Higher Education (originally sponsored by Representatives Pollet, Manweller, Sells, Zeiger, Tarleton, Haler, and Kilduff)

1 AN ACT Relating to Central Washington University's fifth year 2 promise; adding a new section to chapter 28B.35 RCW; adding a new 3 section to chapter 28B.15 RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that students' 6 ability to graduate is often seriously impacted by the lack of access 7 to advising, degree completion tools, the lack of capacity or availability of required courses needed for degree completion, and 8 the lack of information about specific degree or program requirements 9 and when those are offered. In addition, student indebtedness may be 10 11 increased and students may lose limited financial aid when they are not able to graduate in four years. The legislature finds that there 12 13 are software and advising programs available that can reduce the 14 likelihood of these impacts.

15 (2) The legislature commends Central Washington University's 16 willingness to guarantee that any student in a four-year degree 17 program who commits to following a pathway outlined by advisors and 18 degree-planner software, but does not graduate in four years, will be 19 able to enroll in his or her remaining required courses for free in 20 the fifth year. The legislature supports this promise and intends for 1 it to serve as an innovative pilot for other institutions of higher 2 education.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28B.35 4 RCW to read as follows:

5 (1) Central Washington University is authorized to offer a 6 program that promises that a student enrolled in a four-year 7 baccalaureate degree program will graduate within four years or 8 Central Washington University will allow the student to enroll in his 9 or her remaining required courses for free in the fifth year, as long 10 as the student:

11 (a) Commits to following a degree pathway developed in 12 conjunction with his or her advisor and degree-planner software;

(b) Attempts to enroll in courses required for his or her degree program pursuant to the plan developed in (a) of this subsection when those courses are offered; and

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(c) Maintains satisfactory academic progress.

17 (2) Central Washington University shall use local funds to 18 support its commitment to provide free enrollment in remaining 19 courses for a student meeting the description in subsection (1) of 20 this section.

(3) Subject to an appropriation provided for this subsection, Central Washington University shall purchase a degree-planner software package that provides students and staff with an online interface to track degree requirements, student progress, and forecast personnel, lab, and classroom space needs.

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 28B.15 27 RCW to read as follows:

Subject to the limitations of RCW 28B.15.910, the governing board of Central Washington University may waive all or a portion of the tuition fees and services and activities fees for students qualifying for Central Washington University's fifth year promise, as authorized in section 2 of this act.

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
