<u>HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 2020-4657</u>, by Representatives Kilduff, Chambers, Thai, Orwall, and Shea

1 WHEREAS, National protections were written into law thirty years 2 ago, while the origin of advocacy for persons with disabilities began 3 as early as 1936 when a grass roots organization of parents from all 4 over Washington state formed; and

5 WHEREAS, Nearly a quarter of Washingtonians live with some type 6 of disability and rely on such protections every day; and

7 WHEREAS, Advocates with disabilities and families taught the 8 nation that disability is a part of human existence and developed the 9 rallying cry "nothing about us without us"; and

10 WHEREAS, The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) was the first 11 monumental piece of civil rights legislation for persons with 12 disabilities; and

13 WHEREAS, The ADA was the accomplishment of disabled advocates, 14 families, and allies of all races, ethnicities, creeds, genders, 15 abilities, and sexual orientations; and

16 WHEREAS, The ADA provided an encompassing definition of 17 disability that contends disability is not a barrier to an 18 individual's participation in society; and

19 WHEREAS, Washington state is still working to ensure that all 20 persons with disabilities have equal opportunities and access to 21 participate fully in our society; and

22 WHEREAS, The ADA has been an instrumental tool for advocates with 23 disabilities and families to address such barriers; and 1 WHEREAS, We remain committed to working alongside self-advocates 2 and their families to address the barriers to equal opportunity and 3 participation in society;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commemorate the thirtieth anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act, which was the result of persistent efforts of selfadvocates, their families, and allies from the disability community.
