WHEREAS, Survivors of violent crimes and domestic violence often carry physical scars, injuries, and disabilities as a result of surviving these attacks; and

- WHEREAS, According to the United Health Foundation, "America's Health Rankings in 2021," for every 1,000 residents of Washington, there were 2.94 instances of violent crime in the form of murders, rapes, robberies, and aggravated assaults; and
- 8 WHEREAS, According to the Washington Association of Sheriffs and 9 Police Chiefs, over the course of 2020, Washington saw a 47 percent 10 increase in murders from 2019; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The National Coalition Against Domestic Violence 12 estimates that 41.4 percent of Washington women and 31.7 percent of 13 Washington men experience intimate partner rape, stalking, or other 14 physical violence; and
- 15 WHEREAS, According to the U.S. Department of Justice report
  16 "Socio-emotional Impact of Violent Crime," victims often face
  17 nonphysical challenges, such as the possibility of trauma and
  18 posttraumatic stress or socioemotional problems, affecting their
  19 ability to trust or function day to day; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The impact of violent crime often affects more than just 21 the direct victims, devastating thousands of these victims' families 22 and friends across Washington as well; and
