## ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5010

- 1 AN ACT Relating to updating the endangerment with a controlled
- 2 substance statute to include fentanyl or synthetic opioids; and
- 3 amending RCW 9A.42.100.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.42.100 and 2005 c 218 s 4 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- (1) A person is guilty of the crime of endangerment with a controlled substance if the person knowingly or intentionally permits a dependent child or dependent adult to be exposed to, ingest,
- inhale, or have contact with ((methamphetamine)):
- 11 <u>(a) Fentanyl or synthetic opioids, or the smoke of a substance</u> 12 that the person knows, or reasonably should know, contains, or is
- 13 contaminated with, fentanyl or synthetic opioids, excepting
- 14 medications administered or provided during the delivery of health
- 15 <u>care services or pursuant to a valid prescription; or</u>
- 16 <u>(b) Methamphetamine</u> or ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or anhydrous 17 ammonia, including their salts, isomers, and salts of isomers, that
- 18 are being used in the manufacture of methamphetamine, including its
- 19 salts, isomers, and salts of isomers.
- 20 (2) The department of children, youth, and families and any
- 21 employees, interns, volunteers, or contractors of the department

- 1 acting in the scope of their role are exempt from any criminal
- 2 <u>liability within this section.</u>
- 3 (3) Endangerment with a controlled substance is a class B felony.
