1 AN ACT Relating to prescription coverage and the use of mail 2 order services; adding a new section to chapter 48.43 RCW; and 3 providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 48.43 6 RCW to read as follows:

7 (1) Health carriers, for health plans issued or renewed on or 8 after January 1, 2022, that include prescription drug coverage, must 9 ensure enrollees are protected from unintentional use of or 10 enrollment in a nonresident pharmacy.

The health carrier must include in any contract with a 11 (2) pharmacy benefit manager, as defined in RCW 48.200.020, a requirement 12 13 that the pharmacy benefit manager require any contracted nonresident 14 pharmacy to obtain affirmative authorization, in writing or through 15 electronic communication, from a health plan enrollee prior to 16 filling an enrollee's prescription and billing the enrollee's health 17 plan. The authorization from the enrollee may permit the use of a nonresident pharmacy for the plan year. 18

19 (3) Each nonresident pharmacy shipment must include a notice to 20 the enrollee clearly describing the actions that the enrollee can 21 take to terminate use of the nonresident pharmacy. 1 (4) The health plan must allow enrollees to opt out of mandatory 2 use of a nonresident pharmacy, and include information in the 3 enrollee health plan booklet explaining the requirement to obtain the 4 enrollee's affirmative authorization prior to filling a prescription 5 through a nonresident pharmacy.

6 (5) The health plan may not, as a condition of payment or 7 reimbursement, require an enrollee to purchase pharmacy services 8 exclusively through a nonresident pharmacy.

9 (6) This section does not apply to nonresident pharmacies with 10 specialty pharmacy accreditation from a nationally recognized 11 accreditation entity.

12 (7) For the purposes of this section, "nonresident pharmacy" has13 the same meaning as in RCW 18.64.360.

14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act takes effect January 1, 2022.

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
