1 AN ACT Relating to increasing the availability of engineering
2 programs in public universities; and amending RCW 28B.10.115 and
3 28B.20.060.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.10.115 and 2003 c 82 s 1 are each amended to read
6 as follows:

7 The courses of instruction of both the University of Washington and
8 Washington State University shall embrace as major lines, pharmacy,
9 architecture, (~~civil engineering, mechanical engineering, chemical~~
10 ~~engineering,~~) and forest management as distinguished from forest
11 products and logging engineering which are exclusive to the University
12 of Washington. These major lines shall be offered and taught at said
13 institutions only.

14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.20.060 and 1985 c 218 s 2 are each amended to read
15 as follows:

16 The courses of instruction of the University of Washington shall
17 embrace as exclusive major lines, law, medicine, forest products,

1 logging engineering, library sciences, (~~aeronautic and astronautic~~
2 ~~engineering,~~) and fisheries.
