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## SENATE BILL 5379

State of Washington 64th Legislature 2015 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to adding posttraumatic stress disorder to the
- 2 terminal or debilitating medical conditions that qualify for the
- 3 medical use of marijuana; and amending RCW 69.51A.010.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 69.51A.010 and 2010 c 284 s 2 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter 8 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
  - (1) "Designated provider" means a person who:
- 10 (a) Is eighteen years of age or older;
- 11 (b) Has been designated in writing by a patient to serve as a 12 designated provider under this chapter;
- 13 (c) Is prohibited from consuming marijuana obtained for the 14 personal, medical use of the patient for whom the individual is 15 acting as designated provider; and
- 16 (d) Is the designated provider to only one patient at any one 17 time.
- 18 (2) "Health care professional," for purposes of this chapter 19 only, means a physician licensed under chapter 18.71 RCW, a physician 20 assistant licensed under chapter 18.71A RCW, an osteopathic physician 21 licensed under chapter 18.57 RCW, an osteopathic physicians'

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- assistant licensed under chapter 18.57A RCW, a naturopath licensed under chapter 18.36A RCW, or an advanced registered nurse practitioner licensed under chapter 18.79 RCW.
  - (3) "Medical use of marijuana" means the production, possession, or administration of marijuana, as defined in RCW 69.50.101( $(\frac{q}{q})$ ) (t), for the exclusive benefit of a qualifying patient in the treatment of his or her terminal or debilitating illness.
    - (4) "Qualifying patient" means a person who:
  - (a) Is a patient of a health care professional;

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- 10 (b) Has been diagnosed by that health care professional as having 11 a terminal or debilitating medical condition;
- 12 (c) Is a resident of the state of Washington at the time of such 13 diagnosis;
- 14 (d) Has been advised by that health care professional about the 15 risks and benefits of the medical use of marijuana; and
- 16 (e) Has been advised by that health care professional that they 17 may benefit from the medical use of marijuana.
- 18 (5) "Tamper-resistant paper" means paper that meets one or more 19 of the following industry-recognized features:
- 20 (a) One or more features designed to prevent copying of the 21 paper;
- 22 (b) One or more features designed to prevent the erasure or 23 modification of information on the paper; or
  - (c) One or more features designed to prevent the use of counterfeit valid documentation.
    - (6) "Terminal or debilitating medical condition" means:
- 27 (a) Cancer, human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), multiple 28 sclerosis, epilepsy or other seizure disorder, or spasticity 29 disorders; ((<del>or</del>))
- 30 (b) Intractable pain, limited for the purpose of this chapter to mean pain unrelieved by standard medical treatments and medications; 32 ((or))
- 33 (c) Glaucoma, either acute or chronic, limited for the purpose of this chapter to mean increased intraocular pressure unrelieved by standard treatments and medications;  $((\Theta r))$
- 36 (d) Crohn's disease with debilitating symptoms unrelieved by 37 standard treatments or medications;  $((\Theta r))$
- (e) Hepatitis C with debilitating nausea or intractable pain unrelieved by standard treatments or medications; ((<del>or</del>))

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- 1 (f) Diseases, including anorexia, which result in nausea, 2 vomiting, wasting, appetite loss, cramping, seizures, muscle spasms, 3 or spasticity, when these symptoms are unrelieved by standard 4 treatments or medications; ((or))
  - (g) Posttraumatic stress disorder; or
  - (h) Any other medical condition duly approved by the Washington state medical quality assurance commission in consultation with the board of osteopathic medicine and surgery as directed in this chapter.
    - (7) "Valid documentation" means:

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- 11 (a) A statement signed and dated by a qualifying patient's health 12 care professional written on tamper-resistant paper, which states 13 that, in the health care professional's professional opinion, the 14 patient may benefit from the medical use of marijuana; and
- 15 (b) Proof of identity such as a Washington state driver's license 16 or identicard, as defined in RCW 46.20.035.

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
