- AN ACT Relating to creation of a work group to study and make recommendations on a monument to honor residents who died in the global war on terror; creating a new section; and providing an expiration date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1)(a) A legislative work group is established to study and make recommendations on a monument on the capitol campus to honor service members who died in the global war on terror. The work group membership shall be composed of:
- 10 (i) One member from each of the four major caucuses of the 11 legislature;
- 12 (ii) The director of the department of veterans affairs or his or 13 her designee;
- 14 (iii) The director of the Washington state parks and recreation 15 commission or his or her designee;
- 16 (iv) The director of the department of enterprise services or his 17 or her designee;
- 18 (v) The director of the Washington state military department or 19 his or her designee;
- 20 (vi) The secretary of state or his or her designee;
- 21 (vii) The state archivist or his or her designee;

- (viii) A representative of the capitol campus design advisory committee that is not the secretary of state or a legislative member already designated to be part of the work group; and
- (ix) Two representatives from veterans organizations appointed by the governor.
 - (b) The work group shall choose two cochairs from among its legislative membership. The legislative membership shall convene the initial meeting of the work group before November 1, 2019.

- (a) Conduct a study of the feasibility of establishing a new 10 11 memorial on the capitol campus to honor fallen service members from 12 the global war on terrorism;
- 13 (b) Provide the names of the recommended individuals to be 14 honored at the memorial;
- (c) Recommend locations where the memorial could be constructed 15 16 on the capitol campus and provide any permit requirements or other 17 restrictions that may exist for each location;
- (d) Provide potential draft designs that could be used for the 18 memorial; 19
- 20 (e) Provide information regarding the anticipated funding needed 21 for:
 - (i) The design, construction, and placement of the memorial;
 - (ii) Any permits that may be required;
 - (iii) Anticipated ongoing maintenance cost for the memorial based on potential materials used and historical maintenance of other memorials on campus; and
- (iv) An unveiling ceremony or other expenses that may be 27 necessary for the memorial; 28
- (f) Make recommendations regarding the funding sources that may be available, which may include solicitation of private funds or a 31 method for obtaining the necessary funds; and
 - (g) Make recommendations regarding an agency, committee, or commission to coordinate the design, construction, and placement of a memorial on the capitol campus.
 - (3) Staff support for the work group must be provided by the senate committee services and the house of representatives office of program research.

 - (6) This section expires November 1, 2021.
