## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5713

State of Washington 65th Legislature 2017 Regular Session

**By** Senate Higher Education (originally sponsored by Senators Palumbo, Wilson, Zeiger, and King)

1 AN ACT Relating to creating the skilled worker outreach, 2 recruitment, and career awareness training program; and adding a new 3 chapter to Title 28C RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The definitions in this section apply 6 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires 7 otherwise.

8 (1) "Department" means the department of commerce.

9 (2) "Eligible applicant" means any government or nongovernment 10 entity or organization that offers, or plans to offer, a skilled 11 worker awareness training program and that has partnered with 12 industry to offer or fund a skilled worker awareness training 13 program.

14 (3) "Grant program" means the skilled worker outreach,15 recruitment, and career awareness training program.

16 (4) "Grant review committee" means the skilled worker outreach, 17 recruitment, and career awareness training program review committee 18 as created in section 5 of this act.

19 (5) "Matching grant" means a grant funded by the state to match 20 funding provided by an eligible applicant to support efforts to 21 increase the state's skilled workforce. (6) "Skilled worker awareness training program" means an
 accredited educational, occupational education, state-approved
 preapprenticeship, apprenticeship, or similar training program that:
 (a) Trains or retrains individuals to perform a skill that is

5 needed in the workforce;

6 (b) Awards an industry or state recognized certificate, 7 credential, associate degree, professional license, or similar 8 evidence of achievement upon completion of the program; and

9 (c) Does not include an educational program that awards a 10 bachelor's or higher degree upon completion of the program.

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. Subject to availability of amounts 12 appropriated for this specific purpose, the skilled worker outreach, 13 recruitment, and career awareness training program is created. The 14 purpose of the grant program is to increase the state's skilled 15 workforce by awarding matching grants to eligible applicants to:

16 (1) Engage in outreach and recruiting efforts to increase 17 enrollment in and completion of skilled worker awareness training 18 programs and, by partnering with business and industry, to determine 19 current, future, and critical workforce needs; and

20 (2) Provide skilled worker awareness training.

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** (1) The department shall administer the 22 grant program and establish a process for accepting grant 23 applications, including application guidelines and deadlines.

(2) By January 1, 2018, and annually no later than January 1stthereafter, the department shall start accepting grant applications.

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** (1) To be considered for a matching grant, 27 an eligible applicant with an existing skilled worker awareness 28 training program or that is planning to offer a skilled worker 29 awareness training program must include, at a minimum, the following 30 information in its application:

(a) A description of how the matching grant will be used to
 recruit participants to and provide an outreach plan for its existing
 or proposed skilled worker awareness training program;

34 (b) A description of the skilled worker awareness training 35 program it plans to offer or offers, including the location of the 36 program, the particular skills taught, and if an existing program, 37 the number of years it has been in operation;

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1 (c) Past, current, and projected enrollment in the skilled worker 2 awareness training program, and if an existing program, the estimated increases in enrollment; 3

(d) If an existing skilled worker awareness training program, a 4 comparison of the number of participants who enroll in the program 5 б and the number of participants who complete the program over a five-7 year period, if available;

(e) Specific industry needs or gaps in the workforce that the 8 planned or existing skilled worker awareness training program will or 9 does address; 10

11 (f) A description of intended or existing partnerships with industry members, including those where program participants will 12 have the opportunity to earn income or credit hours; 13

14 (g) Costs or the anticipated costs to operate the skilled worker 15 awareness training program;

16 (h) Resources that the eligible applicant will commit in matching 17 dollars if a matching grant is awarded, and if the skilled worker awareness training program already exists, existing resources that 18 the eligible applicant has invested in recruiting, outreach, and 19 20 funding of its skilled worker awareness training program; and

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(i) Any other information the department requires.

Upon receipt of application that satisfies 22 (2) an the this section, the department must 23 requirements in send the application to the grant review committee for its consideration. 24

25 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. (1) The department must establish a grant committee 26 review to review grant applications and make 27 recommendations on who should receive a matching grant and the amount. The grant review committee must consist of twelve members 28 with representatives from the following: 29

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(a) The department of labor and industries;

(b) The department of employment security; 31

(c) The department of enterprise services; 32

(d) The workforce training and education coordinating board; 33

(e) The state board for community and technical colleges; 34

35 (f) Two representatives from business;

(g) Two representatives from labor; and 36

(h) Two representatives from the Washington apprenticeship and 37 38 training council.

(2) The grant review committee shall designate a chair to oversee
 the committee's meetings.

3 (3) The grant review committee shall establish criteria for 4 ranking eligible applicants for matching grant awards. The grant 5 review committee shall consider and rank eligible applicants based on 6 which have the best potential to:

7 (a) Reach a broad diverse audience through their recruitment and8 outreach efforts;

9 (b) Significantly increase enrollment and completion of their 10 skilled worker awareness training program;

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(c) Fill existing needs for skilled workers in the market;

12 (d) Have demonstrated the following, prioritized in the following 13 order:

14 (i)(A) That the eligible applicant will provide monetary 15 contributions from its own resources; or

(B) That the eligible applicant has contributed its own resourcesin the form of monetary or in-kind matching contributions; and

18 (ii)(A) That the eligible applicant has secured an industry 19 partner; or

20 (B) That the eligible applicant has secured from an industry 21 partner a monetary or in-kind contribution, conditional job placement 22 guarantees or articulation agreements, or that the industry partner 23 has contributed other meaningful investment in skilled worker 24 awareness training programs.

(4) The grant review committee shall submit its recommendations to the director of the department, who shall determine to whom and in what amounts to award matching grants. Matching grants must be awarded no later than April 1st each year following the application submittal deadline.

30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. Grant recipients shall not use matching 31 grants for tuition subsidies or to reduce tuition for a skilled 32 worker awareness training program.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. (1) Each eligible applicant that receives 34 a matching grant shall submit a quarterly report and an annual report 35 to the grant review committee on the outcomes achieved. The grant 36 recipient shall include in the report at least the following 37 measurable outcomes:

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(a) The manner in which the grant recipient has used the matching
 grant to provide outreach and recruit participants in its skilled
 worker awareness training program;

(b) The number of participants enrolled in and the number of
participants who completed the skilled worker awareness training
program, both before the matching grant was awarded and since the
matching grant was received;

8 (c) The number of skilled worker awareness training participants 9 who obtained employment in an industry for which the participant was 10 trained under the program, including information about the industry 11 in which the participants are employed;

(d) The number of participants recruited; and

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(e) Any other information the grant review committee determinesappropriate.

15 (2) By December 1, 2019, and by each December 1st thereafter, the 16 grant review committee shall submit an annual report to the governor 17 and appropriate committees of the legislature in accordance with the 18 reporting requirements in RCW 43.01.036. The report must include:

(a) The number of matching grants awarded in the prior year,including the amount, recipient, and duration of each matching grant;

(b) The number of individuals who enrolled in and completed a skilled worker awareness training program offered by each grant recipient;

(c) The number of individuals who obtained employment in a position that uses the skills for which they were trained through a skilled worker awareness training program offered by a grant recipient; and

(d) Other information obtained from grant recipients' reportsunder subsection (1) of this section.

30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. To assist with implementation of the grant 31 program, the department, in coordination with the workforce training 32 and education coordinating board, shall assess current and future 33 workforce needs and coordinate skilled worker awareness training and 34 education programs throughout the state. The coordination must 35 include:

36 (1) Identifying current, future, and critical workforce needs;

37 (2) Partnering with industry associations, labor/management 38 programs, and businesses to assess and determine their workforce 39 needs; and

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(3) Coordinating with skilled worker awareness training program
 providers on skill sets being developed and the quality of applicants
 being trained.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. The skilled worker outreach, recruitment, 4 5 and career awareness training program account is created in the custody of the state treasurer. The department shall deposit in the б account all money received for the program. The account shall be 7 self-sustaining and consist of funds appropriated by the legislature 8 for the skilled worker outreach, recruitment, and career awareness 9 10 training program and private contributions to the program. Expenditures from the account shall only be used for matching grants 11 provided to grant recipients. Only the director of the department or 12 13 the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the account. The account is subject to the allotment procedures under chapter 14 15 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 10. Sections 1 through 9 of this act 17 constitute a new chapter in Title 28C RCW.

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
