AN ACT Relating to increasing involvement of private housing developers in the nine percent low-income housing tax credit program; and creating new sections.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

Sec. 1. The legislature finds that in order to 5 NEW SECTION. 6 address the housing shortage crisis in Washington, a more diverse mix 7 of developers should have access to tax credit programs that incentivize the development of low-income housing. The legislature 8 further finds that private developers have greater incentive to keep 9 10 development costs down. The legislature further finds that a report 11 published by the joint legislative audit and review committee found 12 that private developers could develop the same unit at roughly 87 percent of the cost as a nonprofit developer and roughly 78 percent 13 of the cost as a governmental agency. The legislature therefore 14 15 intends to increase participation of private developers in the 16 housing finance commission's low-income housing tax credit program in order to both increase the supply of low-income housing as well as 17 18 further reduce costs.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The Washington state housing finance commission shall amend internal policies and project scoring criteria
