State of Washington

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the public's
- 6 access to their elected officials and the public's participation in
- 7 legislative affairs is essential to the health of a representative
- 8 democracy. The legislature further finds that to ensure that the
- 9 public maintains such access to the historic state capitol buildings,
- 10 where legislative and executive affairs take place, there is a state
- 11 interest in allowing open parking space in the vicinity of the historic
- 12 capitol campus.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.61 RCW
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, local
- 16 authorities are prohibited from enacting any ordinance or resolution
- 17 that restricts parking on any street within five hundred yards of any
- 18 of the following state buildings:

4	(d) The	Cherberg building;
5	(e) The	Newhouse building;
б	(f) The	Pritchard building;

9 (2) A local authority may put a time restriction of four hours on 10 parking as described under subsection (1) of this section between 9:00 11 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily during the week between Monday morning and 12 Friday evening.
