## SENATE BILL 5974

State of Washington 65th Legislature 2017 3rd Special Session

AN ACT Relating to the supervision of licensed assistant behavior analysts and certified behavior technicians; amending RCW 18.380.010 and 18.380.050; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 18.380.010 and 2015 c 118 s 1 are each amended to 7 read as follows:

8 The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter 9 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

(1) <u>"Authorized supervisor" means:</u>

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(a) A licensed behavior analyst; or

12 (b) A psychiatrist, psychologist, or advanced registered nurse 13 practitioner who is licensed under this title and is able to 14 demonstrate to the secretary, upon request, competency to supervise 15 the practice of applied behavior analysis.

16 (2) "Certified behavior technician" means a paraprofessional who 17 implements a behavior analysis treatment plan under the close, 18 ongoing supervision of ((a licensed behavior analyst)) an authorized 19 <u>supervisor</u> or a licensed assistant behavior analyst, but who does not 20 design or supervise the implementation of a behavior analysis 21 treatment plan. 1 (((2))) (3) "Committee" means the Washington state applied 2 behavior analysis advisory committee.

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(((3))) (4) "Department" means the department of health.

(((4))) (5) "Licensed assistant behavior analyst" means 4 an individual who is licensed under this chapter to engage in the 5 6 practice of applied behavior analysis under the supervision of ((a 7 licensed behavior analyst)) an authorized supervisor.

(((<del>(5)</del>)) <u>(6)</u> "Licensed behavior analyst" means an individual who 8 is licensed under this chapter to engage in the practice of applied 9 behavior analysis. 10

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(((<del>(6)</del>))) <u>(7)</u>(a) "Practice of applied behavior analysis" means:

12 (i) The design, implementation, and evaluation of instructional and environmental modifications based on scientific research and the 13 direct observation and measurement of behavior and the environment to 14 produce socially significant improvements in human behavior; 15

16 (ii) Empirical identification of functional relations between 17 behavior and environmental factors, known as functional assessment 18 and analysis; and

19 (iii) Utilization of contextual factors, motivating operations, antecedent stimuli, positive reinforcement, and other consequences to 20 21 assist individuals in developing new behaviors, increasing or 22 decreasing existing behaviors, and emitting behaviors under specific environmental conditions. 23

(b) "Practice of applied behavior analysis" does not include 24 25 psychological testing, diagnosis of a mental or physical disorder, 26 neuropsychology, psychotherapy, cognitive therapy, sex therapy, psychoanalysis, hypnotherapy, or counseling as treatment modalities. 27 It also does not include the use of behavioral techniques described 28 29 in (a)(iii) of this subsection alone as treatment modalities.

(((7))) (8) "Secretary" means the secretary of the department of 30 31 health.

**Sec. 2.** RCW 18.380.050 and 2015 c 118 s 5 are each amended to 32 read as follows: 33

(1) The secretary shall issue a license to an applicant who 34 submits a completed application, pays the appropriate fees, and meets 35 the following requirements: 36

37 (a) For a licensed behavior analyst:

38 (i) Graduation from a master's or doctorate degree program in behavior analysis or other natural science, education, 39 human

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1 services, engineering, medicine, or field related to behavior 2 analysis approved by the secretary;

3 (ii) Completion of a minimum of two hundred twenty-five classroom
4 hours at graduate level instruction in specific behavior analysis
5 topics, as determined in rule;

6 (iii) Successful completion of a supervised experience 7 requirement, consisting of a minimum of one thousand five hundred 8 hours, or an alternative approved by the secretary by rule; and

9 (iv) Successful completion of an examination approved by the 10 secretary;

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(b) For a licensed assistant behavior analyst:

12 (i) Graduation from a bachelor's degree program approved by the 13 secretary;

14 (ii) Completion of one hundred thirty-five classroom hours of 15 instruction in specific behavior analysis topics, as determined by 16 the secretary in rule; and

17 (iii) Successful completion of a supervised experience 18 requirement, consisting of a minimum of one thousand hours, or an 19 alternative approved by the secretary by rule;

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(c) For a certified behavior technician:

(i) Successful completion of a training program of at least fortyhours that is approved by the secretary; and

23 (ii) Any other requirements determined by the secretary in rule;

24 (d) Demonstrates good moral character;

(e) Has not engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined in RCW18.130.180;

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(f) Is not currently subject to any disciplinary proceedings; and

(g) Is not unable to practice with reasonable skill and safety as defined in RCW 18.130.170.

30 (2) In addition, an applicant for an assistant behavior analyst 31 license ((or a behavior technician certification)) must provide proof 32 of ongoing supervision by ((a licensed behavior analyst)) an 33 authorized supervisor, and an applicant for a behavior technician 34 certification must provide proof of ongoing supervision by an 35 authorized supervisor or a licensed assistant behavior analyst.

36 (3) The secretary may accept certification by a national 37 accredited professional credentialing entity in lieu of the specific 38 requirements identified in subsection (1)(a) through (c) of this 39 section. 1 (4) A license or certification issued under this section is valid 2 for a period of two years.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate 4 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 5 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 6 effect July 1, 2017.

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
