1 AN ACT Relating to enhancing state local effort assistance 2 funding for public schools; amending RCW 28A.500.015; and providing 3 an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.500.015 and 2022 c 108 s 4 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (1) Beginning in calendar year ((2020)) 2025 and each calendar 8 year thereafter, the state must provide state local effort assistance 9 funding to supplement school district enrichment levies as provided 10 in this section.

11 (2) (a) For an eligible school district with an actual enrichment 12 levy rate that is less than ((one dollar and fifty cents)) \$1.50 per ((thousand dollars)) \$1,000 of assessed value in the school district, 13 14 the annual local effort assistance funding is equal to the school 15 district's maximum local effort assistance multiplied by a fraction 16 equal to the school district's actual enrichment levy rate divided by 17 ((one dollar and fifty cents)) \$1.50 per ((thousand dollars)) \$1,000 18 of assessed value in the school district.

(b) For an eligible school district with an actual enrichment levy rate that is equal to or greater than ((one dollar and fifty cents)) <u>\$1.50</u> per ((thousand dollars)) <u>\$1,000</u> of assessed value in the school district, the annual local effort assistance funding is
equal to the school district's maximum local effort assistance.

(c) Beginning in calendar year ((2022)) 2025, for state-tribal 3 education compact schools ((established under)) subject to chapter 4 28A.715 RCW, the annual local effort assistance funding is equal to 5 6 the actual enrichment levy per student as calculated by the superintendent of public instruction for the previous year for the 7 school district in which the state-tribal education compact school is 8 located, up to a maximum per student amount of ((one thousand five 9 hundred fifty dollars as increased by inflation from the 2019 10 calendar year)) \$2,250, increased for inflation beginning in calendar 11 12 year 2025, multiplied by the student enrollment of the state-tribal education compact school in the prior school year. 13

(d) (i) Beginning in calendar year 2025, for charter schools 14 established under chapter 28A.710 RCW, the annual local effort 15 assistance funding is equal to the actual enrichment levy per student 16 17 as calculated by the superintendent of public instruction for the previous year for the school district in which the charter school is 18 19 located, up to a maximum per student amount of \$2,250, increased for inflation beginning in calendar year 2025, multiplied by the student 20 21 enrollment of the charter school in the prior school year.

(ii) The legislature must appropriate annual local effort
assistance funds for charter schools from the Washington opportunity
pathways account in accordance with RCW 28A.710.270.

(3) The state local effort assistance funding provided under this section is not part of the state's program of basic education deemed by the legislature to comply with the requirements of Article IX, section 1 of the state Constitution.

(4) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout thissection unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

31 (a) "Eligible school district" means a school district where the 32 amount generated by a levy of ((one dollar and fifty cents)) \$1.5033 per ((thousand dollars)) \$1,000 of assessed value in the school 34 district, divided by the school district's total student enrollment 35 in the prior school year, is less than the state local effort 36 assistance threshold.

37 (b) For the purpose of this section, "inflation" means, for any 38 school year, the rate of the yearly increase of the previous calendar 39 year's annual average consumer price index for all urban consumers,

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Seattle area, using the official current base compiled by the bureau
of labor statistics, United States department of labor.

3 (c) "Maximum local effort assistance" means the difference 4 between the following:

5 (i) The school district's actual prior school year enrollment 6 multiplied by the state local effort assistance threshold; and

7 (ii) The amount generated by a levy of ((one dollar and fifty 8 cents)) <u>\$1.50</u> per ((thousand dollars)) <u>\$1,000</u> of assessed value in 9 the school district.

10 (d) "Prior school year" means the most recent school year 11 completed prior to the year in which the state local effort 12 assistance funding is to be distributed((, except as follows:))

13 (i) In the 2022 calendar year, if 2019-20 school year average 14 annual full-time equivalent enrollment is greater than the school 15 district's 2020-21 school year average annual full-time equivalent 16 enrollment, "prior school year" means the 2019-20 school year.

17 (ii) In the 2023 calendar year, if 2019-20 school year average 18 annual full-time equivalent enrollment is greater than the school 19 district's 2021-22 school year average annual full-time equivalent 20 enrollment, "prior school year" means the 2019-20 school year)).

(e) "State local effort assistance threshold" means ((one thousand five hundred fifty dollars)) \$2,250 per student, increased
for inflation beginning in calendar year ((2020)) 2025.

24 (f) "Student enrollment" means the average annual full-time 25 equivalent student enrollment.

(5) For districts in a high/nonhigh relationship, the enrollments of the nonhigh students attending the high school shall only be counted by the nonhigh school districts for purposes of funding under this section.

30 (6) For school districts participating in an innovation academy 31 cooperative established under RCW 28A.340.080, enrollments of 32 students attending the academy shall be adjusted so that each 33 participant district receives its proportional share of student 34 enrollments for purposes of funding under this section.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. Section 1 of this act takes effect January 36 1, 2025.

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
