AN ACT Relating to requirements for fund-raising activities of bona fide charitable nonprofit organizations; amending RCW 9.46.0311 and 9.46.070; and adding a new section to chapter 9.46 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9.46.0311 and 1987 c 4 s 26 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 legislature hereby authorizes bona fide charitable or The nonprofit organizations to conduct bingo games, raffles, sweepstakes, 8 amusement games, and fund-raising events, and to utilize punchboards 9 10 and pull-tabs and to allow their premises and facilities to be used 11 by only members, their guests, and members of a chapter or unit 12 organized under the same state, regional, or national charter or 13 constitution, to play social card games authorized by the commission, 14 when licensed, conducted, or operated ((pursuant to the provisions 15 of)) under this chapter and rules ((and regulations)) adopted 16 ((pursuant thereto)) under this chapter.

17 Sec. 2. RCW 9.46.070 and 2020 c 127 s 3 are each amended to read 18 as follows:

19 The commission shall have the following powers and duties:

1 (1) To authorize and issue licenses for a period not to exceed one year to bona fide charitable or nonprofit organizations approved 2 by the commission meeting the requirements of this chapter and any 3 rules ((and regulations)) adopted ((pursuant thereto)) under this 4 chapter permitting said organizations to conduct bingo games, 5 raffles, <u>sweepstakes</u>, amusement games, and social card games, to 6 utilize punchboards and pull-tabs in accordance with ((the provisions 7 chapter and any rules ((and regulations)) 8 o£)) this adopted ((pursuant thereto)) under this chapter, and to revoke or suspend 9 said licenses for violation of ((any provisions of)) this chapter or 10 any rules ((and regulations)) adopted ((pursuant thereto: PROVIDED, 11 12 That)) under this chapter. However, the commission shall not deny a license to an otherwise qualified applicant in an effort to limit the 13 number of licenses to be issued((: PROVIDED FURTHER, That the)). The 14 15 commission or director shall not issue, deny, suspend, or revoke any 16 license because of considerations of race, sex, creed, color, or 17 national origin((: AND PROVIDED FURTHER, That the commission)) and may authorize the director to temporarily issue or suspend licenses 18 subject to final action by the commission; 19

(2) To authorize and issue licenses for a period not to exceed 20 21 one year to any person, association, or organization operating a business primarily engaged in the selling of items of food or drink 22 23 for consumption on the premises, approved by the commission meeting the requirements of this chapter and any rules ((and regulations)) 24 25 adopted ((pursuant thereto)) under this chapter permitting said 26 person, association, or organization to utilize punchboards and pulltabs and to conduct social card games as a commercial stimulant in 27 28 accordance with ((the provisions of)) this chapter and any rules 29 ((and regulations)) adopted ((pursuant thereto)) under this chapter and to revoke or suspend said licenses for violation of any 30 31 provisions of this chapter and any rules ((and regulations)) adopted 32 ((pursuant thereto: PROVIDED, That)) under this chapter. However, the 33 commission shall not deny a license to an otherwise qualified applicant in an effort to limit the number of licenses to be 34 issued((: PROVIDED FURTHER, That the)). The commission may authorize 35 the director to temporarily issue or suspend licenses subject to 36 final action by the commission; 37

38 (3) To authorize and issue licenses for a period not to exceed 39 one year to any person, association, or organization approved by the 40 commission meeting the requirements of this chapter and meeting the

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1 requirements of any rules ((and regulations)) adopted by the 2 commission pursuant to this chapter ((as now or hereafter amended)), 3 permitting said person, association, or organization to conduct or 4 operate amusement games in such manner and at such locations as the 5 commission may determine. The commission may authorize the director 6 to temporarily issue or suspend licenses subject to final action by 7 the commission;

(4) To authorize, require, and issue, for a period not to exceed 8 one year, such licenses as the commission may by rule provide, to any 9 person, association, or organization to engage in the manufacturing, 10 11 selling, distributing, or otherwise supplying of devices, equipment, 12 software, hardware, or any gambling-related services for use within this state for those activities authorized by this chapter. The 13 commission may authorize the director to temporarily issue or suspend 14 15 licenses subject to final action by the commission;

16 (5) To establish a schedule of annual license fees for carrying 17 on specific gambling activities upon the premises, and for such other activities as may be licensed by the commission, which fees shall 18 19 provide to the commission not less than an amount of money adequate to cover all costs incurred by the commission relative to licensing 20 under this chapter and the enforcement by the commission of ((the 21 22 provisions of)) this chapter and rules ((and regulations)) adopted 23 ((pursuant thereto: PROVIDED, That)) under this chapter. However, all licensing fees shall be submitted with an application therefor and 24 25 such portion of said fee as the commission may determine, based upon its cost of processing and investigation, shall be retained by the 26 27 commission upon the withdrawal or denial of any such license 28 application as its reasonable expense for processing the application and investigation into the granting thereof((: PROVIDED FURTHER, That 29 if). If, in a particular case, the basic license fee established by 30 31 the commission for a particular class of license is less than the 32 commission's actual expenses to investigate that particular application, the commission may at any time charge to that applicant 33 such additional fees as are necessary to pay the commission for those 34 costs. The commission may decline to proceed with its investigation 35 and no license shall be issued until the commission has been fully 36 paid therefor by the applicant((: AND PROVIDED FURTHER, That the)). 37 The commission may establish fees for the furnishing by it 38 to 39 licensees of identification stamps to be affixed to such devices and equipment as required by the commission and for such other special 40

1 services or programs required or offered by the commission, the 2 amount of each of these fees to be not less than is adequate to 3 offset the cost to the commission of the stamps and of administering 4 their dispersal to licensees or the cost of administering such other 5 special services, requirements or programs;

6 (6) To prescribe the manner and method of payment of taxes, fees, 7 and penalties to be paid to or collected by the commission;

(7) To require that applications for all licenses contain such 8 information as may be required by the commission((: PROVIDED, That)). 9 However, all persons (a) having a managerial or ownership interest in 10 11 any gambling activity, or the building in which any gambling activity 12 occurs, or the equipment to be used for any gambling activity, (b) participating as an employee in the operation of any gambling 13 activity, or (c) participating as an employee in the operation, 14 15 management, or providing of gambling-related services for sports 16 wagering, shall be listed on the application for the license and the 17 applicant shall certify on the application, under oath, that the persons named on the application are all of the persons known to have 18 19 an interest in any gambling activity, building, or equipment by the person making such application((: PROVIDED FURTHER, That the)). The 20 21 commission shall require fingerprinting and national criminal history 22 background checks on any persons seeking licenses, certifications, or 23 permits under this chapter or of any person holding an interest in any gambling activity, building, or equipment to be used therefor, or 24 25 of any person participating as an employee in the operation of any gambling activity. All national criminal history background checks 26 27 shall be conducted using fingerprints submitted to the United States 28 department of justice-federal bureau of investigation. The commission must establish rules to delineate which persons named on the 29 30 application are subject to national criminal history background 31 checks. In identifying these persons, the commission must take into 32 consideration the nature, character, size, and scope of the gambling 33 activities requested by the persons making such applications;

34 (8) To require that any license holder maintain records as 35 directed by the commission and submit such reports as the commission 36 may deem necessary;

(9) To require that all income from bingo games, raffles, and amusement games be recorded and reported as established by rule ((or regulation)) of the commission to the extent deemed necessary by considering the scope and character of the gambling activity in such

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1 a manner that will disclose gross income from any gambling activity, 2 amounts received from each player, the nature and value of prizes, 3 and the fact of distributions of such prizes to the winners thereof;

(10) To regulate and establish maximum limitations on income 4 derived from bingo. In establishing limitations pursuant to this 5 6 subsection the commission shall take into account: (a) ((the)) The 7 nature, character, and scope of the activities of the licensee; (b) the source of all other income of the licensee; and (c) the 8 percentage or extent to which income derived from bingo is used for 9 charitable, as distinguished from nonprofit, purposes. However, the 10 11 commission's powers and duties granted by this subsection are 12 discretionary and not mandatory;

(11) To regulate and establish the type and scope of and manner of conducting the gambling activities authorized by this chapter, including but not limited to, the extent of wager, money, or other thing of value which may be wagered or contributed or won by a player in any such activities;

18 (12) To regulate the collection of and the accounting for the fee 19 which may be imposed by an organization, corporation, or person 20 licensed to conduct a social card game on a person desiring to become 21 a player in a social card game in accordance with RCW 9.46.0282;

(13) To cooperate with and secure the cooperation of county, city, and other local or state agencies in investigating any matter within the scope of its duties and responsibilities;

(14) In accordance with RCW 9.46.080, to adopt ((such)) rules ((and regulations as are deemed)) necessary to carry out ((the purposes and provisions of)) this chapter. All rules ((and regulations)) shall be adopted pursuant to the administrative procedure act, chapter 34.05 RCW;

30 (15) To set forth for the perusal of counties, city-counties, 31 cities and towns, model ordinances by which any legislative authority 32 thereof may enter into the taxing of any gambling activity authorized 33 by this chapter;

(16) (a) To establish and regulate a maximum limit on salaries or wages which may be paid to persons employed in connection with activities conducted by bona fide charitable or nonprofit organizations and authorized by this chapter, where payment of such persons is allowed, and to regulate and establish maximum limits for other expenses in connection with such authorized activities, including but not limited to rent or lease payments. However, the

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commissioner's powers and duties granted by this subsection are
 discretionary and not mandatory.

(b) In establishing these maximum limits the commission shall 3 take into account the amount of income received, or expected to be 4 received, from the class of activities to which the limits will apply 5 6 and the amount of money the games could generate for authorized charitable or nonprofit purposes absent such expenses. The commission 7 may also take into account, in its discretion, other factors, 8 including but not limited to, the local prevailing wage scale and 9 whether charitable purposes are benefited by the activities; 10

(17) To authorize, require, and issue for a period not to exceed 11 12 one year such licenses or permits, for which the commission may by rule provide, to any person to work for any operator of any gambling 13 activity authorized by this chapter in connection with that activity, 14 or any manufacturer, supplier, or distributor of devices for those 15 16 activities in connection with such business. The commission may 17 authorize the director to temporarily issue or suspend licenses subject to final action by the commission. The commission shall not 18 require that persons working solely as volunteers in an authorized 19 activity conducted by a bona fide charitable or bona fide nonprofit 20 21 organization, who receive no compensation of any kind for any purpose 22 from that organization, and who have no managerial or supervisory 23 responsibility in connection with that activity, be licensed to do such work. The commission may require that licensees employing such 24 25 unlicensed volunteers submit to the commission periodically a list of the names, addresses, and dates of birth of the volunteers. If any 26 volunteer is not approved by the commission, the commission may 27 require that the licensee not allow that person to work in connection 28 29 with the licensed activity;

30 (18) To publish and make available at the office of the 31 commission or elsewhere to anyone requesting it a list of the 32 commission licensees, including the name, address, type of license, 33 and license number of each licensee;

(19) To establish guidelines for determining what constitutes
 active membership in bona fide nonprofit or charitable organizations
 for the purposes of this chapter;

37 (20) To renew the license of every person who applies for renewal 38 within six months after being honorably discharged, removed, or 39 released from active military service in the armed forces of the 40 United States upon payment of the renewal fee applicable to the

1 license period, if there is no cause for denial, suspension, or 2 revocation of the license;

3 (21) To authorize, require, and issue, for a period not to exceed 4 one year, such licenses as the commission may by rule provide, to any 5 person, association, or organization that engages in any sports 6 wagering-related services for use within this state for sports 7 wagering activities authorized by this chapter. The commission may 8 authorize the director to temporarily issue or suspend licenses 9 subject to final action by the commission;

10 (22) To issue licenses under subsections (1) through (4) of this 11 section that are valid for a period of up to ((eighteen)) <u>18</u> months, 12 if it chooses to do so, in order to transition to the use of the 13 business licensing services program through the department of 14 revenue; and

15 (23) To perform all other matters and things necessary to carry 16 out ((the purposes and provisions of)) this chapter.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 9.46 RCW 18 to read as follows:

(1) Bona fide charitable or nonprofit organizations authorized to conduct activities under this chapter may sponsor or conduct sweepstakes, subject to the following conditions:

(a) No entry fee may be charged to participate in a sweepstakesauthorized by this subsection.

(b) A bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization may ask for a donation on the same sweepstakes entry form if the donation does not increase the chances of winning and this is clearly stated next to the donation request.

(c) Entry into or participation in a sweepstakes must be limitedto persons 18 years of age or older.

30 (d) Any sweepstakes offered in Washington must be open to all 31 residents of Washington.

(e) All permitted means of entry, including the use of electronic
 or scanner codes, must clearly indicate that no purchase is required
 to enter.

35 (f) All sweepstakes entries must provide the entrant with equal 36 odds of winning.

37 (g) Advertising of a sweepstakes must comply with the signage and 38 advertising restrictions contained in this chapter and any rules 39 adopted by the commission. 1 (h) This section does not authorize sweepstakes where consumers 2 are entitled to an allotment or accumulation of points based on 3 purchases made over a period of time that can be redeemed for prizes, 4 things of value, or additional sweepstakes entries.

5 (2) The following unfair acts or practices undertaken by, or 6 omissions of, any bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization in 7 the operation of any sweepstakes are prohibited and punishable under 8 this chapter or under rules adopted by the commission:

9 (a) Misrer

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(a) Misrepresenting in any manner the odds of winning a prize;

10 (b) Misrepresenting in any manner the rules, terms, or conditions 11 of participation in a contest;

12 (c) Failing to clearly and conspicuously disclose with all 13 contest sweepstakes and with all promotional sweepstakes all of the 14 following:

(i) The maximum cost of any postage and handling fees that aparticipant may be asked to pay to enter the sweepstakes;

17 (ii) The date or dates on or before which the contest will 18 terminate and upon which all prizes will be awarded; and

(iii) All rules, terms, and conditions of the contest;

20 (d) Failing to clearly and conspicuously disclose the exact 21 nature and approximate value of the prizes when offered;

(e) Failing to award and distribute all prizes of the value and type represented;

(f) Falsely representing, directly or by implication, that the number of participants has been significantly limited, or that a particular person has been selected to win a prize;

(g) Representing, directly or by implication, that a particular person has won any money, prize, thing, or other value in a contest unless there has been a real contest in which at least a majority of the participants have failed to win a prize, money, thing, or other value;

32 (h) Representing, directly or by implication, that a particular 33 person has won any money, prize, thing, or other value without 34 disclosing the exact nature and approximate value of the item; or

(i) Failing to obtain the express written or oral consent of individuals before their names are used for a promotional purpose in connection with a mailing to a third person.

38 (3) Contestants must, clearly and conspicuously, be given the 39 opportunity to indicate if they wish to enter a phase of the contest 40 for free, except for reasonable postage and handling fees of up to

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1 \$1.50 plus the actual cost of postage. This must be clearly and 2 conspicuously disclosed at the time of the initial contest 3 solicitation and each time that the fee payment is required.

4 (4) This section does not restrict lawful games licensed under
5 this chapter or operations of the state lottery commission under
6 chapter 67.70 RCW.

7 (5)(a) Solicitation materials containing sweepstakes entry materials must include a clear and conspicuous statement of the no 8 purchase or payment necessary message, in readily understandable 9 10 terms, in the official rules included in those solicitation materials. If the official rules do not appear on the solicitation 11 12 materials, they must appear on the entry-order device included in those solicitation materials. The no purchase or payment necessary 13 message included in the official rules must be set out in a separate 14 15 paragraph and be printed in capital letters in contrasting typeface 16 that is the same size as the largest typeface used in the text of the 17 official rules.

(b) Sweepstakes entries not accompanied by a donation to a bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization must be treated in the same manner as entries that are accompanied by a request for a donation.

21 (c) Solicitation materials containing sweepstakes entry materials 22 or solicitation materials providing information regarding sweepstakes may not represent that an entry in the promotional sweepstakes 23 accompanied by a donation to a bona fide charitable or bona fide 24 25 nonprofit organization will be eligible to receive additional prizes or be more likely to win than an entry not accompanied by a request 26 for donation or that an entry not accompanied by a request for 27 28 donation will have a reduced chance of winning a prize in the 29 promotional sweepstakes.

30 (d) Solicitation materials containing sweepstakes entry materials 31 may not falsely represent that a person has been specially selected 32 in connection with a sweepstakes.

33 (e) Solicitation materials containing sweepstakes entry materials 34 or solicitation materials providing information regarding sweepstakes 35 may not falsely represent that the person receiving the solicitation 36 has received any special treatment or personal attention from the 37 bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization or any officer, 38 employee, or agent of the bona fide charitable or nonprofit 39 organization.

1 (f) Solicitation materials containing sweepstakes entry materials or solicitation materials providing information regarding sweepstakes 2 shall not represent that a prize notice is urgent or otherwise convey 3 an impression of urgency by use of description, phrasing on a mailing 4 envelope, or similar method, unless there is a limited time period in 5 6 which the recipient must take some action to claim, or be eligible to receive, a prize, and the date by which that action is required is 7 clearly and conspicuously disclosed in the body of the solicitation 8 9 materials.

10 (g) Solicitation materials containing sweepstakes entry materials 11 or solicitation materials providing information regarding sweepstakes 12 may not:

(i) Simulate or falsely represent that it is a document authorized, issued, or approved by any court, official, or agency of the United States or any state, or by any lawyer, law firm, or insurance or brokerage company; or

17 (ii) Create a false impression as to its source, authorization, 18 or approval.

19 (6) The official rules for a sweepstakes must disclose 20 information about the date or dates the final winner or winners will 21 be determined.

(7) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout thissection unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

(a) "No purchase or payment necessary message" means the following statement or a statement substantially similar to the following statement: "No purchase or payment of any kind is necessary to enter or win this sweepstakes."

(b) "Official rules" means the formal printed statement of the rules for the promotional sweepstakes appearing in the solicitation materials. The official rules must be prominently identified and all references to the official rules in any solicitation materials must use the designation for the official rules that appears in those materials. Each sweepstakes solicitation must contain a copy of the official rules.

35 (c) "Specially selected" means a representation that a person is 36 a winner, a finalist, in first place or tied for first place, or 37 otherwise among a limited group of persons with an enhanced 38 likelihood of receiving a prize.

39 (d) "Sweepstakes" means a procedure, activity, or event for the 40 distribution of anything of value by lot, chance, or random

1 selection, where the odds for winning a prize are equal for each

2 entry.

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
