1 AN ACT Relating to provision of early intervention services for
2 eligible children with disabilities from birth through two years of
3 age; creating a new section; and providing an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The department of children, youth, and
6 families, in consultation with the department of early learning, the
7 office of the superintendent of public instruction, the office of
8 financial management, the caseload forecast council, legislative
9 fiscal staff, and with advice and assistance from the applicable
10 committees of the state interagency coordinating council, must
11 develop a funding model with which to determine the amount of annual
12 allocations that shall be appropriated in the omnibus appropriations
13 act after July 1, 2019, for early intervention services for children
14 with disabilities from birth through two years of age, which the
15 department of children, youth, and families oversees.

16 (2) The department must submit a final report that includes the
17 agreed-upon funding model and any necessary statutory changes to the
18 office of financial management and the fiscal committees of the
19 legislature no later than September 1, 2018.

20 (3) This section expires July 1, 2020.
