## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6264

State of Washington 68th Legislature 2024 Regular Session

By Senate Early Learning & K-12 Education (originally sponsored by Senators Wellman, Hasegawa, Nobles, Saldaña, and C. Wilson)

- AN ACT Relating to supporting the implementation of competency-1
- 2 based education; amending RCW 28A.230.125; adding a new chapter to
- 3 Title 28A RCW; and repealing RCW 28A.300.810.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: 4
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The definitions in this section apply 6 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires 7 otherwise.
- 8 (1) "Competencies" mean the rigorous, shared expectations for 9 learning that encompass knowledge, skills, and abilities across grade 10 levels. Competencies are broader than learning standards and may 11 encompass multiple learning standards. Competencies are transparent, measurable, relevant, and transferable to multiple contexts.
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- 13 (2)(a) "Competency-based education" means education that includes 14 the following elements:
- 15 (i) Students are empowered daily to make important decisions 16 about their learning experiences, how they will create and apply 17 knowledge, and how they will demonstrate their learning;
- 18 Assessment is a meaningful, positive, and learning experience for students that yields timely, relevant, and 19 actionable evidence; 20

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- 1 (iii) Students receive timely, differentiated support based on 2 their individual learning needs;
- 3 (iv) Students progress based on evidence of mastery, not seat 4 time;
- 5 (v) Students learn actively using different pathways and varied 6 pacing;
- 7 (vi) Strategies to ensure equity for all students are embedded in 8 the culture, structure, and pedagogy of schools and education 9 systems; and
- 10 (vii) Rigorous, common expectations for learning, including 11 knowledge, skills, and dispositions, are explicit, transparent, 12 measurable, and transferable.
- 13 (b) "Mastery-based learning" has the same meaning as "competency-14 based education."
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) By September 1, 2024, the office of the superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules to authorize full-time enrollment funding for students enrolled in competency-based education programs identified by the state board of education based on:
- 20 (a) School membership in the mastery-based learning collaborative 21 established in section 502(2), chapter 334, Laws of 2021 or the 22 school having a current waiver from credit-based graduation 23 requirements granted by the state board of education under RCW 24 28A.300.750; or
- 25 (b) The process developed by the state board of education under 26 section 3 of this act.
- 27 (2) Rules adopted pursuant to this section must permit school 28 districts to report full-time equivalent students in eligible 29 competency-based education programs for general apportionment 30 funding.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) The state board of education shall 31 develop and recommend a process to identify and designate schools and 32 school districts that are implementing competency-based education and 33 34 identify costs associated with this process. This process must consider the extent to which competency-based education is being 35 implemented as compared to the seven elements of the definition in 36 37 section 1 of this act. The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall consult with the state board of education on how 38

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1 this designation can be displayed on the Washington state report card 2 website.

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- (2) The office of the superintendent of public instruction, in consultation with the state board of education, shall develop and recommend a process for the office of the superintendent of public instruction to create competencies aligned with the state learning standards and identify costs associated with this process. process must incorporate relevant materials and guidance developed through the mastery-based learning collaborative established in section 502(2), chapter 334, Laws of 2021. The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall submit the recommendations and associated costs developed in accordance with this subsection to the state board of education by December 1, 2025.
- (3) The state board of education shall include recommendations and associated costs developed in accordance with this section in the report required by section 502(2), chapter 475, Laws of 2023 that is due December 31, 2025.
- <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The Washington interscholastic activities association shall include in its rule adoption process a review of 19 whether the rule would create any potential barriers related to 21 students participating in competency-based education in order to ensure continued equitable access to interscholastic activities for those students.
  - Sec. 5. RCW 28A.230.125 and 2019 c 252 s 111 are each amended to read as follows:
    - (1) ((<del>The</del>)) (a) Before the 2025-26 school year, the superintendent of public instruction, in consultation with the fouryear institutions as defined in RCW 28B.76.020, the state board for community and technical colleges, the state board of education, and the workforce training and education coordinating board, shall develop and update for use by all public school districts a standardized high school transcript. The superintendent establish clear definitions for the terms "credits" and "hours" so that school programs operating on the quarter, semester, or trimester system can be compared.
- $((\frac{(2)}{(2)}))$  (b) The standardized high school transcript may include a 36 37 notation of whether the student has earned the Washington state seal of biliteracy established under RCW 28A.300.575. 38

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- (2) Before the 2025-26 school year, the state board of education, 1 in consultation with the four-year institutions as defined in RCW 2 28B.76.020, the state board for community and technical colleges, the 3 office of the superintendent of public instruction, and the workforce 4 training and education coordinating board, shall develop or identify 5 6 and recommend to the office of the superintendent of public instruction a format for a competency-based education high school 7 transcript that can be used by all public school districts as part 8 of, or as an alternative to, the standardized high school transcript 9 developed under subsection (1) of this section. 10
- 11 (3) The office of the superintendent of public instruction must 12 inform public school districts of updates to the transcripts 13 developed under this section.
- 14 <u>(4) For the purposes of this section, "competency-based</u> 15 <u>education" has the same meaning as in section 1 of this act.</u>
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. Sections 1 through 4 of this act constitute a new chapter in Title 28A RCW.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. RCW 28A.300.810 (Innovative learning pilot program) and 2020 c 353 s 2 are each repealed.

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
