- AN ACT Relating to the training and monitoring of guardians; 1
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 11.88 RCW; and creating a new

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. 5 Sec. 1. In order to preserve and protect the 6 rights of people with disabilities and seniors, the legislature 7 creates the quardianship monitoring and training advisory group. This advisory group will address two of the nine goals of the working 8 interdisciplinary network of quardianship stakeholders: Goal number 9 10 eight, helping family guardians navigate the court system and perform 11 guardianship duties; and goal number nine, developing procedures to 12 proactively monitor quardianships. Training for lay quardians and 13 monitoring of guardians are priority recommendations of the 2016 final report of the joint legislative and executive committee on

- aging and disability issues. 15
- 16 Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 11.88 NEW SECTION.
- 17 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) The department of social and health services shall convene an 18
- 19 advisory group to accomplish the following:

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- 1 (a) To develop a model program to monitor guardians appointed 2 under this chapter. This program must provide for monitoring of both 3 professional guardians and lay guardians;
 - (b) To develop an in-person training program for use by lay quardians across the state.
 - (2) The advisory group shall consist of representatives from:
 - (a) The developmental disabilities ombuds;
- 8 (b) The department of social and health services developmental disabilities administration;
- 10 (c) The department of social and health services aging and long-11 term support administration;
- (d) The long-term care ombuds;
- 13 (e) The administrative office of the courts;
 - (f) The Washington state bar association;
- 15 (g) The superior courts;

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- 16 (h) Local area agencies on aging;
 - (i) The certified professional guardianship board;
- 18 (j) Certified professional guardians;
- 19 (k) A nonprofit organization that advocates for people with 20 intellectual or developmental disabilities;
- 21 (1) A nonprofit organization that advocates for people with 22 mental illness;
- 23 (m) A nonprofit organization that advocates for people with 24 dementia;
 - (n) The Washington state coalition for language access;
 - (o) A nonprofit organization that advocates for senior citizens;
- 27 (p) Two self-advocates who are persons with intellectual or 28 developmental disabilities;
- 29 (q) A union representing individual providers working with the 30 aging and long-term support administration; and
 - (r) An organization representing Washington hospitals.
- 32 (3) In addition to the representatives provided in subsection (2) 33 of this section, the speaker of the house of representatives shall 34 appoint two members of the house of representatives, one from each 35 caucus, and the president of the senate shall appoint two members of 36 the senate, one from each caucus.
- 37 (4) The advisory group shall select two cochairs from among the legislative members appointed under subsection (3) of this section.

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
