SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL 8002

State of Washington 66th Legislature 2019 Regular Session

1 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF 2 THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO 3 THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE UNITED STATES, IN 4 CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, 7 respectfully represent and petition as follows:

8 WHEREAS, The 1st President of the United States George Washington 9 stated, "The basis of our political systems is the right of the 10 people to make and to alter their Constitutions of Government"; and

11 WHEREAS, It was the stated intention of the framers of the 12 Constitution of the United States of America that the Congress of the 13 United States of America should be "dependent on the people alone"; 14 and

15 WHEREAS, That dependency has evolved from a dependency on the 16 people alone to a dependency on those who spend excessively in 17 elections, through campaigns or third-party groups; and

18 WHEREAS, The United States Supreme Court ruling in *Citizens* 19 *United v. Federal Election Commission*, 558 U.S. 310 (2010) removed 20 restrictions on amounts of independent political spending; and

21 WHEREAS, The removal of those restrictions has resulted in the 22 unjust influence of powerful economic forces, which have supplanted 23 the will of the people by undermining our ability to choose our 1 political leadership, write our own laws, and determine the fate of 2 our state; and

3 WHEREAS, Article V of the United States Constitution requires the 4 United States Congress to call a convention for proposing amendments 5 upon application of two-thirds of the legislatures of the several 6 states for the purpose of proposing amendments to the United States 7 Constitution; and

8 WHEREAS, The State of Washington sees the need for a convention 9 to propose amendments in order to address concerns such as those 10 raised by the decision of the United States Supreme Court in *Citizens* 11 *United v. Federal Election Commission* (2010) 130 S.Ct. 876 and 12 related cases and events including those occurring long before or 13 afterward or for a substantially similar purpose, and desires that 14 said convention should be so limited; and

WHEREAS, The State of Washington desires that the delegates to 15 16 said convention shall be comprised equally from individuals currently 17 elected to state and local office, or be selected by election, in each Congressional district for the purpose of serving as delegates, 18 though all individuals elected or appointed to federal office, now or 19 in the past, be prohibited from serving as delegates to the 20 21 Convention, and intends to retain the ability to restrict or expand 22 the power of its delegates within the limits expressed above; and

WHEREAS, The legislature of the State of Washington intends that 23 this joint resolution be a continuing application considered together 24 25 with similar applications calling for a convention on this subject, 26 such as those approved by Vermont legislators (2014 Vermont Joint Resolution Senate No. 27, 160 Congressional Record S4331, POM-284) 27 28 by California lawmakers (2014 California Assembly Joint and 29 Resolution No. 1, 160 Congressional Record S5507, POM-320), and introduced by Montana lawmakers (L.C. No. 0095), until such time as 30 31 the legislatures of two-thirds of the several states have applied for 32 such a convention and that convention has actually been called by 33 Congress;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully request that the people of the State of Washington speaking through its legislature, and pursuant to Article V of the United States Constitution, hereby petition the United States Congress to call a Convention for the purpose of proposing Amendments to the Constitution of the United States of America as soon as two-thirds of the several states have applied for a Convention; and

1 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately transmitted to the President of the United States, the President of 2 the United States Senate, the Speaker of the House of 3 Representatives, the Governor of each state, and the presiding 4 officer of each house of each state legislature in the United States, 5 6 to the Vice President of the United States in his capacity as presiding officer of the United States Senate and addressed to him at 7 the legislative office that he maintains inside the United States 8 Capitol, and each member of Congress from the State of Washington. 9
