- WHEREAS, Washington state ranks ninth in total milk production in the United States, producing 6,584 million pounds annually; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Washington ranks sixth in milk production per cow at 9 24,117 pounds of milk per year; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Milk is the second highest dollar-valued agricultural commodity produced in Washington, valued at 1.28 billion dollars; and

- 12 WHEREAS, Dairy farming has an annual economic impact of 5.2

- WHEREAS, There are over 6,184 on-farm dairy jobs in 39 counties

- 17 WHEREAS, The Washington State Dairy ambassadors for 2015-2016 are
- 18 Ambassador Nicole Buell of Marysville and alternate ambassadors Lynda

- 20 WHEREAS, Dairy Day at the Legislature is January 27, 2016, when
- 21 legislators will visit with the dairy producers of the state and
- 22 enjoy ice cream handed out by the Washington State Dairy Federation,
