AN ACT to repeal 165.71 (2) (b); to renumber 165.71 (1); to amend 165.71 (2) (intro.); and to create 165.71 (1g), 165.71 (2) (bg), 165.71 (2) (bm), 165.71 (2) (dm), 165.71 (2) (em), 165.71 (2) (fm) and 165.71 (2) (m) of the statutes; relating to: displaying a human trafficking resource center hotline poster.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Justice must provide on its website a poster that provides information regarding a human trafficking resource center hotline and must allow entities to download the poster free of charge. Current law also requires DOJ to encourage that the poster be displayed at all of the following places: certain gas stations; hotels; adult entertainment establishments; salons; places at which employers engage employees to perform agricultural labor; hospitals or other medical centers; places at which athletic or sporting events occur; establishments that operate as a massage parlor or spa, alternative health clinic, or similar entity; various expositions; courthouses; Department of Transportation rest areas; and public and private transit stations.

This bill adds the following to the list of places that must be encouraged to display the poster: lodging establishments, premises that serve alcoholic beverages,

tattoo establishments, job recruitment centers, community-based residential facilities, and public and private elementary and secondary schools.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

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- (c) "Campground" means a parcel or tract of land owned by a person, the state, or a local government that is designed, maintained, intended, or used for the purpose of providing campsites, offered with or without charge, for temporary overnight sleeping accommodations.
 - (m) "Lodging establishment" means any of the following:
- 1. A bed and breakfast establishment, as defined in s. 97.01 (1g).
- 2. A hotel or motel. In this subdivision, "hotel" or "motel" has the meaning given for "hotel" in s. 97.01 (7).
 - 3. A tourist rooming house, as defined in s. 97.01 (15k).
 - 4. A short-term rental, as defined in s. 66.0615 (1) (dk).
- 5. A campground.
- **SECTION 3.** 165.71 (2) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 16 165.71 (2) (intro.) The department of justice shall make the poster under sub.
- 17 (1) (1m) available to others to print from its Internet site website and shall encourage 18 its display at each of the following places:
