#### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill requires DNR to award grants of up to \$100,000 to municipalities, federally recognized American Indian tribes or bands located in this state, and nonprofit organizations to plant trees to reduce the effects of urban heat islands. It increases funding for the urban forestry grant program by \$500,000 in the 2023-24 fiscal year, from the Forestry Account of the conservation fund, to provide the grants.

- I. State Fiscal Effect
- A. Urban forestry grant expenditures would increase by \$500,000 to coincide with the one-time funding provided in the bill.
- B. Costs to implement the modifications to the urban forestry grant program are indeterminate and would be absorbed within the Forestry Division's existing budget and staff resources.
- II. Local Fiscal Effect

Revenue for local units of government and federally recognized American Indian tribes or bands would increase to the extent that they successfully compete for an urban forestry grant.
