Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill outlines the duty of pharmacies to dispense any lawfully prescribed drug or device, including provisions stating without delay with certain exclusions defined. Credible complaints under s.450.095(2) will be referred to the Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) as they are now under current law. References to contraception throughout s.450.095(2) have been eliminated in sections amended by the bill. This change broadens the scope of some provisions to all drugs and/ or devices.

The estimated one-time cost of \$3,300 is for 0.1 limited term employee equivalent hours to make updates to procedures and conduct training to reflect changes in the proposed legislation as well as rule promulgation related to off label therapies and standards of conduct. The estimated annual cost of \$22,200 reflects 0.2 FTE of staff time needed for responding to inquiries, investigating complaints, and prosecuting cases.

The one-time and annual estimated costs cannot be absorbed in the currently appropriated agency budget.
