



2011 ASSEMBLY BILL 11

January 31, 2011 – Introduced by Representatives BARCA, BERNARD SCHABER, HINTZ, VRUWINK, MILROY, DANOU, TURNER, SINICKI, ROYS, FIELDS, BERCEAU, SHILLING, SEIDEL, PARISI, CLARK, POPE-ROBERTS, D. CULLEN and HEBL, cosponsored by Senators WIRCH, S. COGGS and TAYLOR. Referred to Committee on Jobs, Economy and Small Business.

- 1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 560.799 (3) (a) of the statutes; **relating to:** authorizing the
2 Department of Commerce to designate one additional enterprise zone.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) may designate an area as an enterprise zone. Commerce must consider a number of factors related to the area prior to designating the area as an enterprise zone, including indicators of the area's economic need and whether designation as an enterprise zone would promote the retention of jobs in the area. A taxpayer who creates or retains jobs in an enterprise zone, or a taxpayer located in an enterprise zone who makes certain purchases from Wisconsin vendors, may claim certain tax benefits. Commerce may designate no more than 12 enterprise zones.

This bill permits Commerce to designate a total of 13 enterprise zones.
