2021 ASSEMBLY BILL 132

March 5, 2021 - Introduced by Representatives SORTWELL, MOSES, ALLEN, BROOKS, EDMING, LOUDENBECK, MAGNAFICI, MURPHY, PRONSCHINSKE, ROZAR, TUSLER, WICHGERS and CABRAL-GUEVARA, cosponsored by Senators BERNIER, NASS and JACQUE. Referred to Committee on Constitution and Ethics.

1 **AN ACT to create** 252.04 (3m) of the statutes; **relating to:** immunization-related
2 mail.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires a government entity; public or private elementary, middle, junior high, or senior high school; childcare center or nursery school; or health care provider that sends a piece of mail containing information that could disclose another person's immunization status to ensure that any information that could disclose a person's immunization status or otherwise allow someone to infer a person's immunization status is enclosed and sealed in the piece of mail and that no such information is visible on the outside of the piece of mail.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 252.04 (3m) of the statutes is created to read:
4 252.04 (3m) Any government entity; public or private elementary, middle,
5 junior high, or senior high school; childcare center or nursery school; or health care
6 provider, as defined in s. 146.81 (1), that sends a piece of mail containing information
7 that could disclose another person's immunization status, including immunization

SECTION 1

1 reminders sent by U.S. mail, shall ensure that any information that could disclose
2 a person's immunization status or otherwise allow someone to infer a person's
3 immunization status is enclosed and sealed within the piece of mail and that no such
4 information is visible on the outside of the piece of mail.
