AUTHORS SUBJECT TO CHANGE

AN ACT *to create* 103.375 of the statutes; **relating to:** prohibiting mandatory vaccination for employment.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Prohibiting vaccination against SARS-CoV-2 as condition of employment

This bill prohibits an employer from requiring an individual to receive a vaccine against the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus or show evidence of having received such a vaccine.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **Section 1.** 103.375 of the statutes is created to read:
- 103.375 Mandatory vaccination for employment prohibited. No employer may require an employee or prospective employee to receive a vaccine against the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus, which causes COVID-19, or show proof of having received such a vaccine, as a condition of an offer of employment or continued employment with the employer.
