2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 57

- 1 AN ACT *to create* 49.79 (1) (bg), 49.79 (1) (em), 49.79 (6m), 49.79 (6p) and 49.79
- 2 (6t) of the statutes; **relating to:** requiring child support compliance for FoodShare benefits.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits certain individuals and parents who refuse to cooperate in determining the paternity of a child or establishing or enforcing a child support order from being eligible for FoodShare benefits. The bill also prohibits certain parents who refuse to cooperate in providing or obtaining support for their child or who are delinquent in child support payments and do not satisfy an exception specified in the bill from being eligible for FoodShare benefits. FoodShare, also known as the food stamp program and the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, provides benefits to eligible low-income households for the purchase of food. FoodShare is administered by the Department of Health Services. The federal government pays the benefits for FoodShare while the state and federal government share the cost of administration.

17	property to which that individual or the child may have rights.

An individual is ineligible 21 to participate in the food stamp program in a month in which the individual is 22 obligated by court order to provide support payments and is delinquent in making 23 those court-ordered payments, unless any of the following is true: 24 (a) The delinquency balance equals less than 3 months of the court-ordered
