



## 2013 ASSEMBLY BILL 603

January 7, 2014 - Introduced by Representatives BORN, SCHRAA, BERNIER, BIES, CZAJA, KLEEFISCH, KNODL, KULP, LEMAHIEU, NASS, PRIDEMORE, SANFELIPPO, STRACHOTA, STROEBEL and THIESFELDT, cosponsored by Senators GROTHMAN and LAZICH. Referred to Committee on Campaigns and Elections.

1     **AN ACT to amend** 6.33 (1), 6.33 (2) (a), 6.34 (2) and 6.82 (1) (a) of the statutes;  
2           **relating to:** providing proof of residence when registering to vote.

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### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

Under current law, except for a military elector or an overseas elector, an elector who registers to vote by mail and has not voted previously in an election in this state or an elector who registers after the close of registration must provide proof of residence. Under this bill, except for military and overseas electors, all electors must provide proof of residence to register to vote.

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***The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:***

3           **SECTION 1.** 6.33 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:  
4           **6.33 (1)** The board shall prescribe the format, size, and shape of registration  
5 forms. All forms shall be printed on cards and each item of information shall be of  
6 uniform font size, as prescribed by the board. The municipal clerk shall supply  
7 sufficient forms to meet voter registration needs. The forms shall be designed to  
8 obtain from each applicant information as to name; date; residence location; location

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1 of previous residence immediately before moving to current residence location;  
2 citizenship; date of birth; age; the number of a current and valid operator's license  
3 issued to the elector under ch. 343 or the last 4 digits of the elector's social security  
4 account number; whether the applicant has resided within the ward or election  
5 district for at least 28 consecutive days; whether the applicant has been convicted of  
6 a felony for which he or she has not been pardoned, and if so, whether the applicant  
7 is incarcerated, or on parole, probation, or extended supervision; whether the  
8 applicant is disqualified on any other ground from voting; and whether the applicant  
9 is currently registered to vote at any other location. The form shall include a space  
10 for the applicant's signature. Below the space for the signature, the form shall state  
11 "Falsification of information on this form is punishable under Wisconsin law as a  
12 Class I felony." The form shall include a space to enter the name of any special  
13 registration deputy under s. 6.26 or 6.55 (6) or inspector, municipal clerk, or deputy  
14 clerk under s. 6.55 (2) who obtains the form and a space for the deputy, inspector,  
15 clerk, or deputy clerk to sign his or her name, affirming that the deputy, inspector,  
16 clerk, or deputy clerk has accepted the form. The form shall include a space for entry  
17 of the ward and aldermanic district, if any, where the elector resides and any other  
18 information required to determine the offices and referenda for which the elector is  
19 certified to vote. The form shall also include a space where the clerk may record an  
20 indication of whether the form is received by mail, a space where the clerk may record  
21 an indication of the type of identifying document submitted by the elector as proof  
22 of residence under s. 6.34, ~~whenever required~~, and a space where the clerk, for any  
23 applicant who possesses a valid voting identification card issued to the person under  
24 s. 6.47 (3), may record the identification serial number appearing on the voting  
25 identification card. Each county clerk shall obtain sufficient registration forms for

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1 completion by an elector who desires to register to vote at the office of the county clerk  
2 under s. 6.28 (4).

3 **SECTION 2.** 6.33 (2) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

4 6.33 (2) (a) All information may be recorded by any person, except that the ward  
5 and aldermanic district, if any, other geographic information under sub. (1), the  
6 indication of whether the registration is received by mail, the type of identifying  
7 document submitted by the elector as proof of residence under s. 6.34, ~~whenever~~  
8 ~~required~~, and any information relating to an applicant's voting identification card  
9 shall be recorded by the clerk. Each applicant shall sign his or her own name unless  
10 the applicant is unable to sign his or her name due to physical disability. In such case,  
11 the applicant may authorize another elector to sign the form on his or her behalf. If  
12 the applicant so authorizes, the elector signing the form shall attest to a statement  
13 that the application is made upon request and by authorization of a named elector  
14 who is unable to sign the form due to physical disability.

15 **SECTION 3.** 6.34 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

16 6.34 (2) Upon completion of a registration form prescribed under s. 6.33, each  
17 eligible elector who is required to register under s. 6.27, who is not a military elector  
18 or an overseas elector, ~~and who registers after the close of registration under s. 6.29~~  
19 ~~or 6.86 (3) (a) 2.~~, shall provide an identifying document that establishes proof of  
20 residence under sub. (3). Each eligible elector who is required to register under s.  
21 6.27, who is not a military elector or an overseas elector, who registers by mail, and  
22 who has not voted in an election in this state shall, if voting in person, provide an  
23 identifying document that establishes proof of residence under sub. (3) or, if voting  
24 by absentee ballot, provide a copy of an identifying document that establishes proof

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1 of residence under sub. (3). If the elector registered by mail, the identifying  
2 document may not be a residential lease.

3 **SECTION 4.** 6.82 (1) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

4 6.82 (1) (a) When any inspectors are informed that an eligible elector is at the  
5 entrance to the polling place who as a result of disability is unable to enter the polling  
6 place, they shall permit the elector to be assisted in marking a ballot by any  
7 individual selected by the elector, except the elector's employer or an agent of that  
8 employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the elector.  
9 Except as authorized in s. 6.79 (6) and (7), the individual selected by the elector shall  
10 present to the inspectors proof of identification and, if the proof of identification does  
11 not constitute proof of residence under s. 6.34, shall also provide proof of residence  
12 under s. 6.34 for the assisted elector, ~~whenever required,~~ and all other information  
13 necessary for the elector to obtain a ballot under s. 6.79 (2). The inspectors shall  
14 verify that the name on the proof of identification presented by the person assisting  
15 the elector conforms to the elector's name on the poll list or separate list and shall  
16 verify that any photograph appearing on that document reasonably resembles the  
17 elector. The inspectors shall then issue a ballot to the individual selected by the  
18 elector and shall accompany the individual to the polling place entrance where the  
19 assistance is to be given. If the ballot is a paper ballot, the assisting individual shall  
20 fold the ballot after the ballot is marked by the assisting individual. The assisting  
21 individual shall then immediately take the ballot into the polling place and give the  
22 ballot to an inspector. The inspector shall distinctly announce that he or she has "a  
23 ballot offered by .... (stating person's name), an elector who, as a result of disability,  
24 is unable to enter the polling place without assistance". The inspector shall then ask,  
25 "Does anyone object to the reception of this ballot?" If no objection is made, the

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1 inspectors shall record the elector's name under s. 6.79 and deposit the ballot in the  
2 ballot box, and shall make a notation on the poll list: "Ballot received at poll  
3 entrance".

4 **SECTION 5. Initial applicability.**

5 (1) This act first applies to registrations received on the effective date of this  
6 subsection.
